

# CLUB TO SEEK HIGHER PLANE

**DIRECTORS AUTHORIZED TO CLOSE AGREEMENT AT CONFERENCE WITH AMERICAN CITY BUREAU MAN.**

Directors of the Bend Commercial club are meeting this afternoon at the Pilot Butte Inn with Colonel C. A. Simmons of the American City bureau, authorized by the club at its noon luncheon today to conclude an agreement with Colonel Simmons having as its aim the bringing of the club to a higher plane of efficiency and civic service. Colonel Simmons was the chief speaker at the club meeting.

Complimenting Bend on its pioneer progressive spirit, the civic expert declared that this intangible spirit is the greatest of the city's assets. "The prime function of a commercial club is to create spirit and to make the people think," he declared. "This includes the spirit of enterprise, the spirit of giving and the habit of honoring the individual who has performed a public service."

Adoption of a general program of work, the obtaining of results from special committees, a method of democratic elections, admitting women to membership, voluntary effort given logically, careful research work by committees, and fostering the spirit of good will make the club that believes in these principles successful, he asserted, basing his belief on the experiences of many other cities and towns which have been served by the American City bureau. As a tangible example of what can be lost to a town, he pointed out that every boy or girl who passes through the city schools and does not remain a resident of Bend means a net retail loss of \$1500 annually.

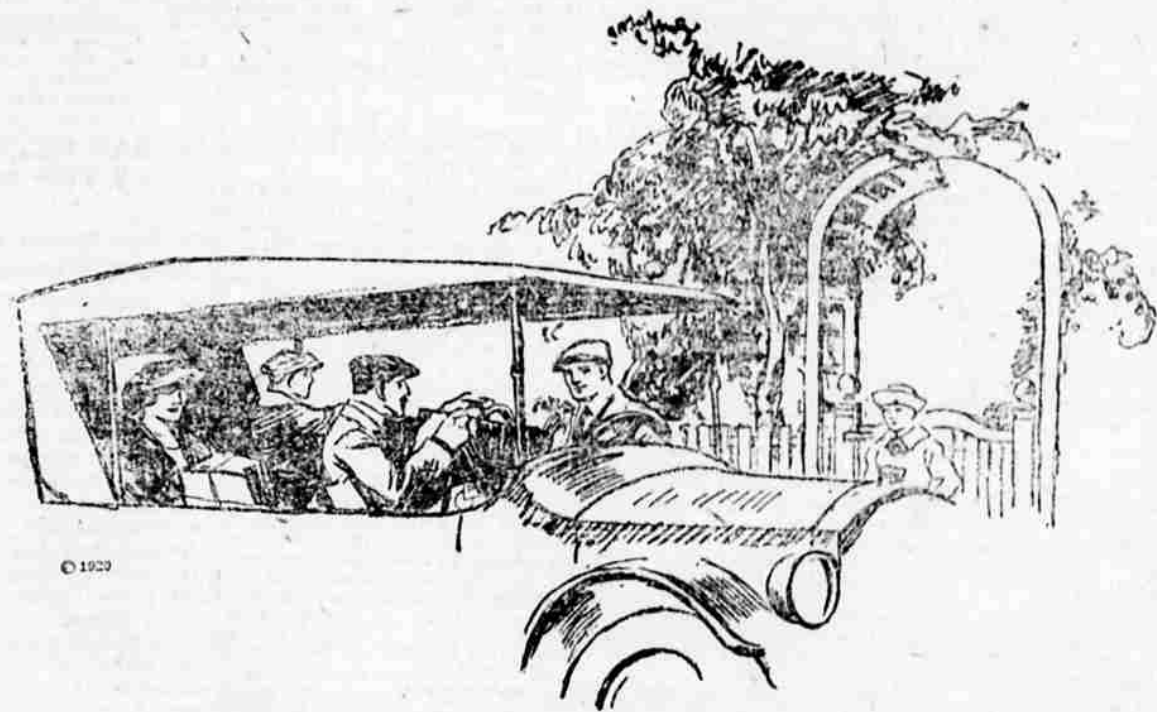
