

# BASEBALL MEN TO SIGN PACT

**DANGER OF WAR AVERTED BY AGREEMENT FOR PEACE CONFERENCE TO BE HELD IN CHICAGO ON FRIDAY.**

 KANSAS CITY, Nov. 10. — Five "loyal" American league club owners have capitulated and will join 11 new National league club owners in a peace conference in Chicago on Friday, it was announced here today by Garry Herrmann, chairman of the national baseball commission. Plans for the reorganization of baseball will be drawn up at the Chicago meeting, and the threatened "war" will probably be averted.

The Chicago meeting will be informal, with none present except the 16 owners. If, after talking things over, they find there is something on which there is a prospect of a decision, the meeting will formally convene and consider it, said President Heydler of the National league.
