

# MANY CHILDREN ARE IN PAGEANT

ALL GRADE SCHOOLS TO TAKE PART

Elaborate Production To Be Staged At The Gymnasium Thursday Evening Under Direction of Bend Instructors.

With children from all the grade schools participating, the Christmas pageant, "The Gifts We Bring," will be presented at the gymnasium, beginning at 7:30 o'clock Thursday evening.

Special costuming, made possible by the work of instructors and parents, will feature the entertainment, which will be one of the most elaborate of the year. The committee in charge of the production is composed of Miss Evelyn Carlson of the Reid school, Miss Jessie Hardie of the Kenwood and Miss Evelline Crow of the Central school. Mrs. Ethel Travis is in charge of musical features.

A synopsis of the pageant is given as follows.

Carol—"Hark, the Herald Angels Sing."

The prologue—Father Time weaving the Christmas story down through the ages.

Scene I—Mother Goose and children preparing for Christmas; carol, "Joy to the World."

Scene II—"The Christmas Dream." The Christmas fairy wakens the children and the dream continues. She summons the Fairies of Love, Peace and Good Will. Then Santa Goodfellow comes, attended by the snow fairy, Jack Frost, and Fairies of Play and Joyfulness. Santa tells the Christmas fairy to "bring all the toys from out the shop. Then appear the Snow Birds, Tinsel Fairies, Christmas Bells, the Dolls, the Jumping Jacks, the Candles, the Automatic Toys, the Stick Candy, the Colored Balls, the Flower Fairies, the Holly.

Scene III—The dream comes true. Mother enters, wishing them a "Merry Christmas." They tell her of the dream and wonder if it cannot come true. Mother summons the Christmas fairy and Santa Goodfellow, who tell them that "when the spirit is right, the dream comes true that very night."

Carol—"It Came Upon a Midnight Clear."

Second episode—Bringing the gifts. Mother and children welcome the children from overseas.

Carol—"Oh, Little Town of Bethlehem." America enters, carrying the flag; Peace carries the dove, the Good Fairy carries the holly wreath; the mother gives the Christmas message.

Carol—"While the Shepherds Watched Their Flocks."



Will keep for weeks, and can be sliced and steamed to serve.</p>	<p><b>Fruit Cake</b></p> <p>1 teaspoon each: cloves, cinnamon, nutmeg, all-spice, all kinds essence</p> <p>1 pound citron</p> <p>1 pound raisins</p> <p>2 1/2 tablespoons cider</p> <p>1 pound currants</p> <p>1 pound dates</p> <p>1/2 cup English walnuts</p> <p>1/2 cup Maraschino cherries</p> <p>2 cups English walnuts</p> <p>Cut the dates and cherries in small pieces and thoroughly dredge all fruit and nuts with flour before stirring into the batter. Bake in slow oven about three hours. This makes four one and one-half pound cakes.</p>
