Vocal numbers were presented—some of them under duress—by Comrades Belden, Connolly, Wilson, Triplett and Huelat. Norman Cobb, champion entertainer of the post, offered some of the usual bits of nonsense and one serious dramatic reading, "Texas, Down by the Rio Grande," in all of which he scored a hit with the audience.
