The amount of money to be raised by this special tax is more than the amount raised by special school district tax in the year immediately preceding this, plus six per cent. It is necessary to raise this additional amount by special levy for the following reasons: Six per cent limitation fixes levy at \$36,209.72, and to meet current needed expenses an excess over six per cent limitation is necessary in the sum of \$83,829.65 because of growth of school system, increase in wages and other operating expenses, since 1916, beyond the ability of an annual six per cent increase to take care of the needs.
