NEW GOVERNMENT OWES ORIGIN TO GALVESTON FLOOD, RECALLED

This is the fifth of 14 articles on the city manager plan, by H. S. Gilbertson, of the National Municipal League.)

Fortunately, the city manager plan has a background of real experience, in the course of which cities have learned a number of important lessons about applying the idea of simplified government. In the light of advances which have been made in the past five years, the first steps toward simplicity now seem crude and inadequate. But they had to be.

The beginnings were made quite by accident at Galveston, in 1901. The city had been devastated by a tidal wave. The old, cumbersome government, with its numerous war councilmen and sundry ingenious devices to prevent action was simply unequal to the situation.

Immediate action being imperative, the governor appointed a commission of five men to get busy and straighten out the town.

The people of Galveston were so pleased with the result that they let the commission be made permanent, but elective.

In the Galveston commission, each member of the commission was constituted a committee of one in charge of a group of functions, such as finance or public works. The whole

group constituted a board of directors.

And that was all there was to it! No "checks and balances." The real check which was set up under this new system arose out of the publicity which attached to every elective officer, in the limelight, subject to constant criticism.

There were so few to be chosen at one time it was perfectly easy for the voters to know exactly what they were doing.

Galveston thrived. Other Texas cities copied the system. In the course of about five years the Greater Des Moines committee, looking about for a new deal in municipal government, discovered the Galveston plan and adopted it, adding the initiative, referendum and recall and non-partisan elections. Other Iowa cities followed.

In another six years, nearly 400 cities, from coast to coast, had come under the Galveston-Des Moines plan.

This old commission government movement, nation-wide in scope, smashed a lot of pet political illusions. It became known that the safest form of government was the one that was most easily and quickly held accountable to public sentiment.

There was only one little group of men for the citizens to watch. And the sense of being watched meant much to the man in the office, coupled with the fact that he could not so easily pass the buck to someone else.

This principle, which has been popularized under the name of the short ballot, is the lasting contribution of the commission form of government movement to political practice in this

country. The commission plan, however, had its defects, serious ones.
