ENGLAND BECOMING MOVIE BATTLEGROUND

American Producers Easy Victors So Far, But Europeans Are Becoming Strong Competitors.

LONDON, Aug. 12.—England at present is the world's battleground for movie magnates.

So far, the United States producers are easy victors. But ever since the end of the war, European producers have been hammering at the American lines. Now the British producers themselves have entered the field.
