**STANFORD STADIUM AHEAD OF SCHEDULE**

**Mammoth Bowl Will Be Ready For Big Game With California In The Fall Is Now Predicted.**

STANFORD UNIVERSITY, Cal., Aug. 18.—Construction on the mammoth stadium here was five days ahead of the engineer's schedule today, and it was expected that the great structure, which will seat 60,000 persons, will be ready for the "big game" with California in the fall.

More than one-third of the dirt from what will be the bottom of the bowl has been removed and construction of the bleachers commenced. A fleet of tractors is engaged in tearing up the soil in huge chunks and piling it on top of the already high surrounding mound.
