ENORMOUS PRICES PAID FOR STAMPS

156,000 Francs Given For One Small Square of Blue Paper From Famous Collection.

PARIS, Sept. 21.—The sum of 156,000 francs has been paid for a single postage stamp, a little square of blue paper from Hawaii with a large figure 2, dated 1851.

It was only one of the famous collection of the late Duke Ferrari de la Renotiere which yielded in one day's sale at the Hotel Drouot, the fabulous sum of 1,100,805 francs.

The Ferrari collection was conceded the finest in the world. The late Duke had inherited a large fortune from his father, an Italian financier, and is said to have spent 200,000 francs annually in buying stamps.
