Best Crabs From Chesapeake Bay. The Chesapeake bay blue crab, the largest specimen found along the Atlantic coast, is considered the best. While these crustaceans were very plentiful a few years ago, it is becoming evident that unless a "closed season" is declared they will become as rare and high priced as terrapin. The little pea crabs, found within oyster shells, are considered a delicacy, while the cancer magister, the large crab of the Pacific coast, is extensively used for food in that part of the country.
