On the other hand, thinking men of Germany welcome the conference, for they feel that it can perhaps reach some agreement whereby Germany will not be under the oppressive and disturbing influence of French militarism.

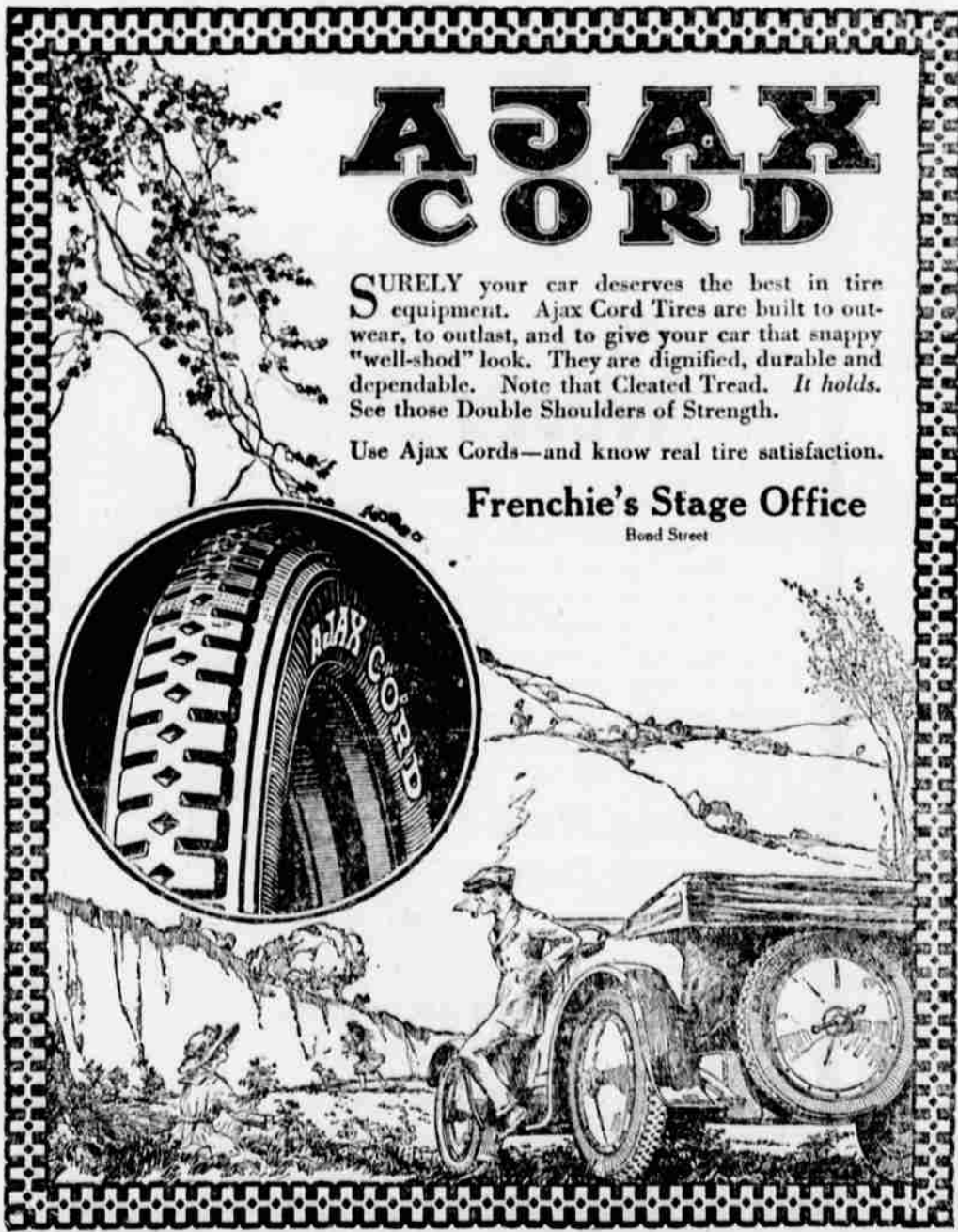
