**IRISH MADE TO
SIGN, DECLARED**

ONE DELEGATE BLAMES BRIT-
ISH PREMIER'S "MONSTROUS
INIQUITY," SECOND DENIES
COERCION STORY.

DUBLIN, Dec. 21.—The Sinn Fein delegation was forced by Lloyd-George's "monstrous iniquity" to sign the Anglo-Irish treaty, George Duffy, delegate who signed the pact, charged in the Irish parliament today. According to Duffy's story, Lloyd-George threatened Ireland with immediate war unless the Irish plenipotentiaries signed the treaty.

Eamonn Duggan, who also signed the treaty, recommended that Dail Eireann ratify the pact, but denied that Lloyd-George coerced the plenipotentiaries. "We were sent to negotiate an agreement, not a republic; the alternative was war, of course," Duggan said.

regulation of all for hire automobiles, stages and trucks engaged in freighting service under jurisdiction of the public service commission. The bill gives the commission authority to fix rates and schedules for stage and truck lines. No such vehicle may operate without such a permit. Only five senators opposed the measure which stands a good chance to pass the house.
