C. E. Culler, U. S. sailor who has been in Bend on a furlough, visiting his wife and parents, left last night to report for duty at Mare Island.

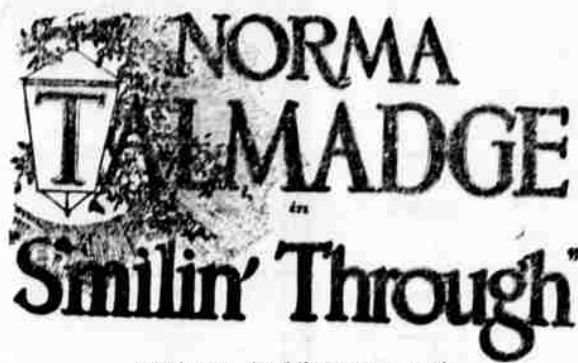
His mother, Mrs. J. C. Culler, was hurt in jumping out of a moving automobile here last week.
