The latest railroad company to express itself as determined to tap Central Oregon through the Bend country is the Eugene & Eastern. J. C. Bracher, director of the company, states that construction of a line from Eugene to Springfield is now under way, and that it will be extended to reach Bend in two years. The Bulletin has it on reliable authority that another irrigation project will soon be in process of construction in Crook county that will rival even that of the Deschutes Irrigation & Power company in size and importance. The scheme is in the first stages of development, but is backed by money men who are able to carry it to a successful close.
