Humidity Remains Below Danger Point, Reported

Although the humidity dipped below the danger point late Tuesday afternoon, it rose rapidly during the night, going up to 76, according to a report from the office of the Deschutes national forest. The low mark, 23, was reached at about 4 o'clock Tuesday afternoon. This is two degrees below the danger point. As long as the humidity approaches the point of saturation at night danger from forest fires is not great, is explained.
