STOCKS SURGE FORWARD AGAIN

Market Activities Gain Constructively

(Wall Street Journal Financial Review)
NEW YORK, May 6.—All the characteristics of a major bull market were present in today's session. Constructive activities gained in increasing vigor in practically every section of the list and further substantial advances occurred in the stocks which have played the principal roles in the current forward movement.

If any section of the market was stronger than the rest, it was the rails. These shares advanced spiritedly under the leadership of Frisco common, which continued its rapid march to record territory. Reading, Lehigh Valley and Wabash "A" also displayed exceptional strength and activity was maintained in the railroad issues. Western Maryland, Gulf, Mobile and Northern and the shares of various other roads strongly mentioned in connection with consolidation projects.

American Can's upsurge to the highest price of its history was the overshadowing development among the industrial shares. Coppers were led by Kennecott and Magna, motors by Maxwell "B" and Willys-Overland preferred; public utilities by Montana Power, Utah Securities, Federal Light & Traction, and electric shares were uniformly buoyant with Westinghouse, General Electric and Allis-Chalmers scoring sharp advances.

Grain Futures Higher At Close of Trading

CHICAGO, May 6.—Grain futures finished sharply higher on the board of trade today. Corn was leader in the day's steady advance.

Bullish statistics were the mainstay in wheat's strong finish. The seaboard sold overseas 200,000 bushels and the Pacific northwest 125,000 bushels. Winnipeg showed great strength despite heavy deliveries and overtaxed elevators.

Corn was the market leader. Good local buying was induced by greatly improved cash demand and a decrease of 2,588,000 bushels in Bradstreet's world visible supply. Cold weather retarded planting operations.

Oats gained strength from other grains. Export inquiries were received in Canadian markets.

Provisions were strong most of the day but receded some late on selling by longs.

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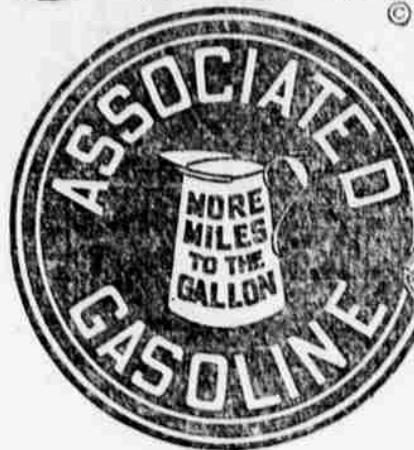
