MONEY PRICE STILL HIGHER

Change Restrains Speculation Today

(Wall Street Journal Financial Review)
NEW YORK, May 12.—Call money rose to 4 per cent in today's session, reflecting preparations to meet government withdrawals totalling \$8,500,000, which will take place at the end of the week. These developments served to restrain speculative enthusiasm, but despite this check a number of vigorous upward movements occurred and the market was fairly free from selling pressure.
Tire shares continued to respond to the strength in the crude rubber situation. United States Rubber reaching further new high ground for the year.
Among the standard industrials, American Can was the outstanding feature, attaining the best price of its history on buying of impressive character. Frisco led the rails, moving into record territory following the publication of its gross earnings up to the end of the first week of May. These figures showed that results so far had substantially exceeded last year's outcome, demonstrating that an increase in the \$5 dividend may reasonably be expected, since it was earned two and a half times in 1924.

CAILLAUX PLAN TOLD DEPUTIES

Use for Dawes Annuities Is Outlined

French Finance Minister Is Anxious to Rebuild Devastated Areas

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin)
PARIS, May 12.—Finance Minister Joseph Caillaux laid before the finance committee of the chamber of deputies today his plan for restoring French finances to normalcy, a plan upon which the fate of the Painleve government depends.
Caillaux announced he wants to use the French share of the Dawes annuities to complete rebuilding the devastated regions and for amortization of the inter-allied debts.

The Painleve cabinet has approved the plan which Joseph Caillaux presented to a chamber committee today and will make each phase of the project a question of confidence when it is presented to the deputies. If the chamber votes against any part of the plan, Painleve will resign.

It was stated yesterday that no note had been received from the United States regarding debts and that conversations between Ambassador Herriek and Caillaux on the subject were not even of a semi-official nature.

Developments at Washington yesterday showed the American government considers debt negotiations once more under way. Any proposal to link France's debt to the United States with the question of reparations payments by Germany would meet with disapproval in Washington, it was said.

Large Egg Take Secured From Crane Prairie Fish

Trout egg taking operations at Crane prairie are proving very successful, with more than 5,000,000 eggs already secured, it is reported by Pearl Lynes, superintendent of the Tumalo fish hatchery. A great number of eggs have also been taken at other locations in the Central Oregon Cascades, especially at Odell lake, reports Lynes.
