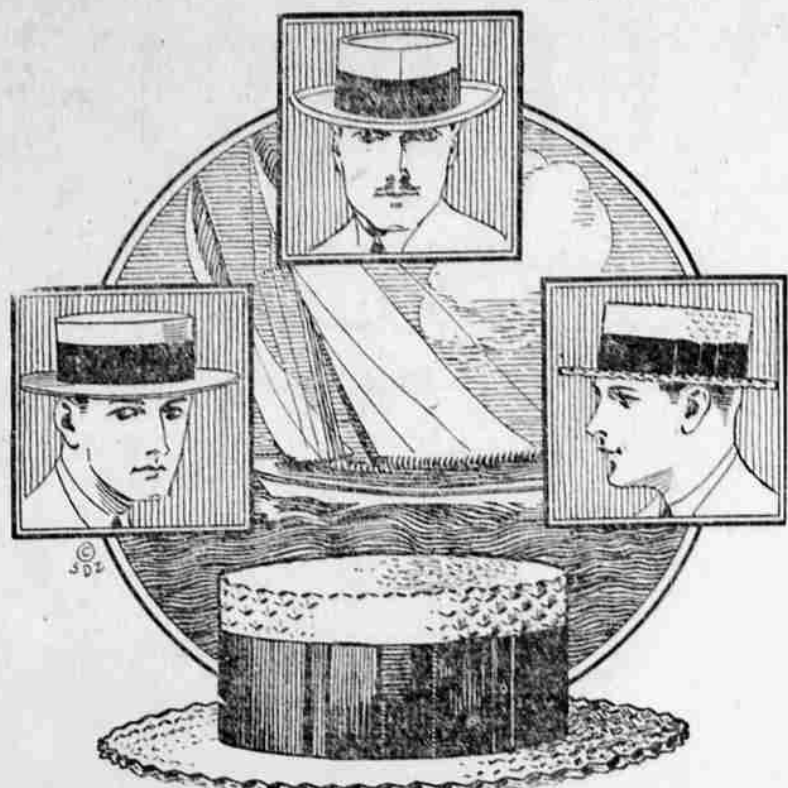

MARKET SEES SHARP GAINS

Little Selling, and Closing Is Higher

(Wall Street Journal Financial Review)

NEW YORK, May 15.—Having spent most of the week in a vain attempt to bring out liquidation for covering purposes, short were forced to bid up prices on themselves in today's session. This uneasiness over the absence of important selling the last few days was heightened when aggressive buying appeared in Mack Truck and American Can, carrying them to record highs.

Sharp advances were staged in industrial specialties such as Fidelity Insurance, Continental Insurance and Cushman Bakeries.
