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Bend Man Kills Wife, Turns Gun On Self

ing of his troubles.

Brook's mother, whose home is in Portland, is owner of the Hotel Cozy.

Last night's double tragedy is the second of its kind in Bend where both husband and wife were killed, but in the first, which took place on Christmas day, 1918, the circumstances were reversed, the wife killing the husband; then herself. The wife and husband of the Christmas tragedy were Mr. and Mrs. George Simms, a couple who had been married for only about six months.

Although Mrs. Simms killed her husband on Christmas day, while he slept, the bodies were not discovered until nearly a week later. Mrs. Simms' left hand was frozen around the handle of a .32 caliber revolver. The motive of the murder and suicide was believed to have been jealousy.

An inquest over the bodies of Mr. and Mrs. Brook will be held this afternoon at 2 o'clock. It is announced by Coroner C. P. Niswonger.
