## FOREST AND GAME RESOURCES SHOWN

### Speakers Stress Importance of Law Observance

Two of Bend's greatest assets, forests and game, came in for consideration at today's weekly forum luncheon of the Bend Commercial club in the Pilot Butte Inn. The program was given over to a discussion of law observance. Speakers were Clarence A. Adams, deputy district game warden; H. L. Plumb, supervisor of the Deschutes national forest, and Tom Carlson, Bend's fire chief, who discussed the relation of law observance in fire prevention and city beautification.

"The only way to get any place in the matter of law observance is for every person to observe the law individually," Adams mentioned in his brief talk to the commercial club members. He was followed on the program by Plumb, who also touched on the matter of the violation of the game laws, saying that only recently some person shot a nesting goose at Crane prairie.

Plumb also discussed law observance in its relation to forest fires, cleanliness of camp sites, preservation of natural beauty adjacent to highways and care with campfires. In connection with law observance in the woods, Plumb reminded his audience of the law passed by the legislature recently, imposing a fine of from \$25 to \$75 on any person throwing any lighted material on ground where it is likely to start a fire which will spread into the woods. This ruling is not confined to the national forests, and the mere act of throwing the lighted material to the earth is sufficient cause for arrest.

People of Bend on the whole are law abiding when in the woods, but a few, primarily through negligence, break the forest laws. It was mentioned by Plumb, if users of forests would be more careful when in the woods, rangers and other forest service employees would have more time for the improvement of camp sites, trails and roads, said the speaker. He also warned against picking mountain flowers in a vandal like manner.

The forest supervisor was followed on the program by Fire Chief Carlson, who discussed the relation of city cleanliness and beautification to fire protection, reminding his audience that Bend looked upon itself as a tourist center. "We can't keep the city clean by throwing ashes in the alleys," said Carlson. He also condemned the practice of throwing rubbish near highways, and mentioned that only recently he had found a place on the river just below town which was being used as a dumping ground. Carlson criticized fire hazards he had found in the business district.

Brief talks were also made by Ross Farnham, local attorney, and Mrs. Ethel V. Johnson, head of the women's protective division. L. Antles, secretary of the club, presided.

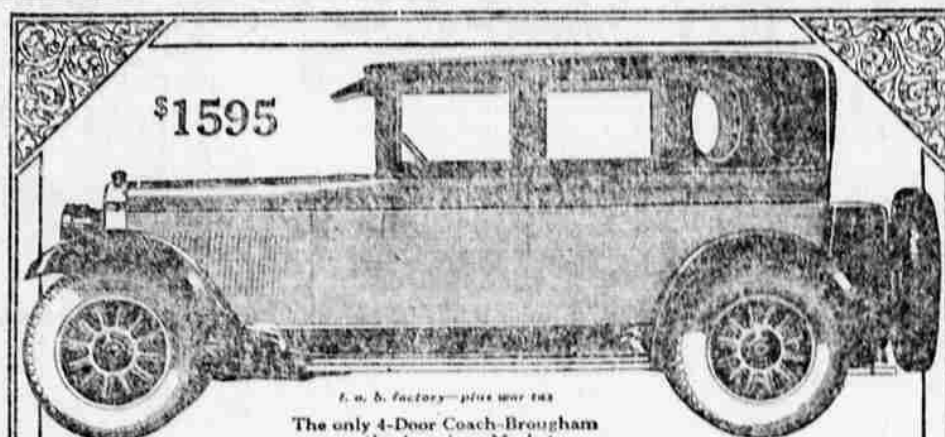
