 In the early days, when Sacramento was the worst city in the world, a vigilance committee loaded all the bad men and women in the town onto a boat, named it "The Devil's Cargo," and shipped them out of town. These people landed in the San Francisco harbor and upon finding they could not enter the city, started a town of their own and named it "Barbara" after the woman who served as their advisor.

Soon the scum from San Francisco found the little city of sin to be an ideal spot in which to carry on their practice of vice.
 In time the place acquired the name "Barbara's Coast," and was later known as Barbary Coast, the name it bears today.

Rykov Named Premier Of Russian Republic

 MOSCOW, May 21.—The central executive committee today, reflecting the cabinet, named the following commissars:
 Premier, Rykov; vice premiers, Kamenev and Tsurupa; foreign affairs, Tchitcherin; war, France; foreign trade, Krassin; finance, Sokolnikov; transport, Rodzinsk; supreme economic council, Dzerzhinski; labor, Schmidt; posts, Sainroy; inspection of peasants, Kuhlshov; internal trade, Scheinmann.

That Trotsky was accorded no place in the cabinet comes as a surprise, since it had been anticipated that Krassin, now ambassador to France, might step down from the foreign trade post and that Trotsky would then obtain it. Trotsky has been elected to the central executive committee, but this far nothing has been done to restore him to an important governmental post since his temporary departure from Moscow after his deposition from the war post.

MANY MINERS SENT TO JAIL

Unionists Aroused By Court Rulings

Question of Closed Or Open Shop May Be Decided In West Virginia

 MORGANTOWN, W. Va., May 21.—Three hundred union workers—including many women—have been thrown in jail in northern West Virginia's mine war.

A series of drastic court injunctions preventing officials of the United Mine Workers challenging operation of mines by non-union labor, has resulted in outbreaks, filled the jails and aroused the entire district.

Other injunctions now are sought which will place this whole coal area virtually under martial law by court orders.

With this protection, coal company officials openly announced today their intention of breaking the union and throwing the entire district—one of the largest producing areas of the nation—into an open shop.

Union officials, on the other hand, declared today they would refuse to obey the injunctions on the ground state courts had been subverted by the coal operators to overthrow their constitutional right of organization.

Form Protest Army
 A protest army of union men and women, several hundred strong, was secretly organized at Granttown, near here, this morning, to march on the non-union operations, with the expectation that all would be arrested for violation of the stringent injunctions.

The army collected at 4 a. m. and behind blaring bands set out down the county road for the non-union mines.

Women carrying American flags sang parodies on popular songs, deriding the "yaller dogs"—the term used by the union men to describe non-union workers. A similar army of 138 was arrested last week and charged with violation of the injunction issued by Judge W. S. Meredith of the circuit court. They will be brought to trial tomorrow at Fairmont.

Half Million Damages Asked In Power Action

 KLAMATH FALLS, May 21.—Suit was filed here Wednesday by the Fort Klamath Meadows company, Fort Klamath, against the California-Oregon Power company on two charges for \$500,000 damages. The first charge is that the power company, by storing water for power purposes in Klamath lake, upon which the Fort Klamath company's land borders, had inundated several thousand acres, making it impossible to cultivate. The second charge is that the power company took water from the lake in such large quantities that the lake dropped below normal, causing serious navigation difficulties for the Fort Klamath concern.

The islands were discovered by Captain Keeling in 1609. The British acquired them in 1836. The population is 749, mostly Malays. It was of these islands that the German cruiser Emden was destroyed by the Australian cruiser Sydney in the World war. The islands were annexed as a British crown colony in 1908.
