

# Fifth Championship Of School Year Won By Bend Team

## BASEBALL LAST ON THE RECORD

### Locals Beat Prineville By Hard Hitting

By defeating the Prineville high school team in the deciding game of the season Thursday afternoon, 5 to 1, the Bend high baseball team won the fifth Central Oregon championship for the first school this year, making a clean sweep of the year's sports with the exception that the boys' basketball title was not definitely decided.

The local baseball team outclassed Prineville at bat and won by cracking out 12 hits, nearly all of them at opportune times. Prineville had a better infield and excelled in base running, each of its runs being scored as a direct result of stolen bases.

Barber of Bend pitched an even steadier game than he had thrown against Mitchell, allowing only four hits and no free passes. He struck out 11 batters. Loomis pitched creditably in the first inning. Barber also got two hits, one of them for three bases.

Brink was the batting star of this game, getting three safe hits, including one for three bases. Marquardt hit safely twice. Due to Barber's tight pitching, the Bend team got no opportunities for spectacular fielding, with the exception of a double play in which Marquardt and Gunderson figured, and which prevented at least one score for Prineville.

**Game Sure in Seventh**  
Prineville scored in the first inning when Arnold got a hit, going out at second on a fielder's choice which left Coshow on first. Coshow stole second and scored when a throw was muffed at third when he started to pillar that base.

Barber tripled in Bend's half of the inning, and was sent across the plate by Brink's single. In the second Bend got two, on two-base hits by Pitman and Shull and a sacrifice by Rollins.

Brink scored in the third when he singled, went to third on an over-throw and scored on Pitman's sacrifice. Mahoney reached first on an error in the fourth inning, went to second on an error, and scored from there on Marquardt's single. Marquardt crossed the plate on Brink's triple. Brink was caught at the plate after a passed ball had been retrieved.

In the seventh inning Bend put the game on ice by scoring three runs. Barber and Marquardt singled and Barber scored when Gillam threw to the plate on Ballantyne's infield grounder. Marquardt and Ballantyne scored on errors.

Prineville got its second run in the fourth inning. Grimes getting a single, stealing second and third and coming home on an infield out. In

Winning this game gives the Bend team an unbroken record of victories for the season and gives Coach James C. Riney a perfect record for the two teams he has coached this year. The football team was tied but not defeated.

In addition to winning repeated victories, the teams this year have excelled in sportsmanship, team morale and discipline during the training season. Attendance at practice was good for all sports, and the members of each squad observed training rules in a manner which was in distinct contrast to past seasons. This result was due not only to the leadership of the various coaches and the cooperation given them by the players, but also in a considerable measure to the efforts of J. H. Loomis, trainer who donated his time and services throughout the year.
