

Season's First Regular Game Between Mills Tomorrow

NEW STRENGTH IS TO BE SHOWN

Hard Contest On O'Donnell Field Expected

The opening match game of the season for the Brooks-Scandon baseball team and the first regular game between the teams of the two lumber companies, will be played Sunday afternoon on O'Donnell field when the newer organization crosses bats with the Shelvin-Hixon team. The game is called for 2:30 o'clock.

In a practice game several weeks ago, Shelvin-Hixon won 20 to 0, but at that time Brooks-Scandon did not have its full team in the field, and had practiced only a few times. In addition to having full strength Sunday, Brooks-Scandon will have a number of new players on the field, and Shelvin-Hixon is anticipating a hard game with prospects none too good for victory.

Shelvin-Hixon, for its part, will be stronger than in last Sunday's game with Redmond, as several players who were away at that time have returned, and it has had more opportunity for practice this week, so that the play on both sides is expected to be the fastest seen here so far this season.
