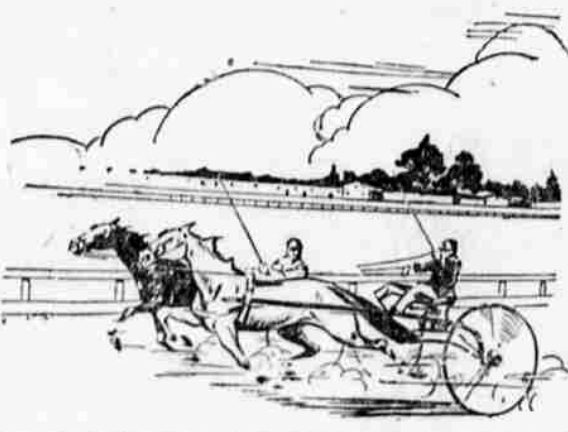

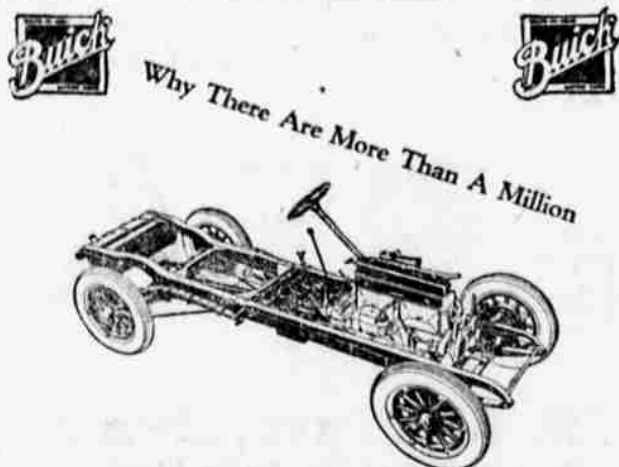

Jaenicke Will Start Metolius Pine Survey

Preparatory to making a survey of the western pine beetle infestation in the Metolius district, A. J. Jaenicke, government entomologist, planned to leave for Hansen's on the Metolius today to establish headquarters.

Jaenicke, who came here from Portland, will be accompanied to the Metolius by three assistants. Two of the assistants arrived here last night. They are A. D. Cannavina, graduate from O. A. C., and M. W. Stone, who has just completed his junior year at O. A. C. The third assistant is coming here from Klamath Falls. It was originally planned to establish a beetle control project in the Metolius country early this spring, but when a preliminary survey was made, it was found that the severe frosts of last winter had killed many of the beetle larvae. The purpose of the present survey is to ascertain the extent of infestation.

Nurmi Tries In Vain to Beat World's Record

Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) CAMBRIDGE, Mass., May 22.—Wind, cold weather and apparently overdrawn condition combined to rob Paavo Nurmi of a new world record in the mile at the Harvard stadium. More than 30,000 persons saw the wonder athlete run the first three quarters of a mile in 3:08 2-5 against 3:08 7-10, the time he made at Stockholm in 1923 when he established his world record of 4:10 2-5. He crossed the line two yards ahead of Jimmy Connolly of Georgetown in 4:15 1-5, 4-5 seconds behind his record.

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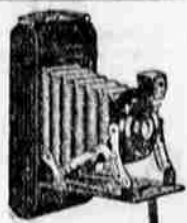
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
