Auto Parked In Road Causes Bad Accident

Injuries which it was first feared might prove serious were suffered late Saturday evening by members of the family of J. M. Elliott when the car in which they were riding hit a gravelled spot in The Dalles-California highway between Redmond and Bend and skidded into another machine.

The direct cause of the accident was a machine parked on the highway. Elliott was forced to turn out a considerable distance to pass the parked car, and it was when getting back into the road that his machine skidded.

Speeding On Approach Of Highway Draws Fine

Four motorists were arrested in Bend over the week end for violations of the traffic laws, and three of them for speeding on the paved highway approach in the north end of the city. They were C. All three were arrested by State Traffic Officer Earl B. Houston.

Enthusiasm Increases Over Elks Convention

Much enthusiasm was manifested for the Elks national convention which is to be held in Portland June 13 to 18, at the meeting of representatives from all Oregon lodges in Portland Saturday to make arrangements for entertaining the 60,000 or more visitors who will be present, reports Circuit Judge T. E. J. Duffy, who was the delegate of the Bend lodge.
