REACTION RULE TRADERS NOTE

Stiffer Rate Quoted On Call Money

(Wall Street Journal Financial Review)

NEW YORK, May 25.—Reaction was the rule in the day's session. Last week's rapid advance on the upside made a period of correction almost imperative and the fact that such a movement developed in ample time was looked upon as an exceedingly healthy indication.

Again the approaching month-end was foreshadowed by a slightly stiffer rate in call money, but the 4% per cent figure established in the afternoon occasioned no apprehension. As a matter of fact, there seems to be plenty of offerings flooding the market and the principal concern of bond dealers at the present moment is to find new offerings. In view of this situation, credit conditions are not likely to hamper stock market operations. Instead, the present ease in money appeared to assure one of the most active summers the stock exchange has ever enjoyed.
