

MAZAMA OUTING THIS WEEK END

Portlanders Will Visit Cove Second Time

Gorge At Junction of Rivers, and Opal Springs Goal of Mountaineers

Repeating their outing of last year the Mazamas, Oregon mountaineering organization, will visit the Cove country—the junction of Crooked and Deschutes rivers—over the Memorial day week end, according to information received here today.

The Mazamas, under the guidance of E. T. Valliant, who headed last year's party also, will leave Portland Friday night, arriving in Culver early Saturday morning. From Culver, the mountain climbers will hike to the Cove. They will hike back to Culver Sunday evening, taking the night train to Portland.

Several local Mazamas, among them W. P. Hardesty, assistant city engineer, will join the Portland group at Culver Saturday morning. It was Hardesty who received the information that the Mazamas were coming to Central Oregon again this year.

Members of the Mazamas who have visited the Cove country concede it to be one of the most attractive places in the state. The mountaineers will visit "No Man's Land"—the rugged peninsula at the junction of the Deschutes and Crooked rivers. Opal springs will also be visited.

NEVER THOUGHT OF FIGHTING U. S.

Former Japanese Minister Denies Inference

German Paper Had Quoted On Land Law of California—Regret Expressed

TOKIO, May 28.—Viscount Goto, former minister of the interior, has never thought of a war between Japan and America—much less talked of it—he told the United Press today in an interview at Shiraahama Springs.

His statement was the result of an alleged interview with a Berlin newspaper which quoted him as saying "a statesman must sometimes think war though not talk it," adding that the California land question was one of "life and death" for Japan. The Berlin paper had interpreted the alleged "thoughts of war" remarks as a suggestion that the statesman foresaw a clash between his own country and the United States.

While the author of the Berlin interview is not now in Tokio, the German embassy explained that there had been perhaps some misinterpretation of Goto's remarks, and expressed regret for the incident.
