

MOTORISTS FAVOR ROAD AROUND TRAP

Ask Highway Commission to Avoid Gold Hill

PORTLAND, May 29.—The Oregon State Motor association pressed the state highway commission yesterday to build a road around Gold Hill,

Oregon, to avoid a "speed trap" there which was obnoxious to all motorists. The commission in discussion held that the move would be too costly, but the association maintained that by a different survey money could actually be saved. The association promised to have its engineer present data at the next meeting on the case. It was announced that contracts for paving the Astoria-Sverson section of the Columbia River highway would not be signed until legal tangles in the matter were ironed out. An Astoria delegation urged that the contracts be signed so that work may start at an early date.

Economy Run Planned By Star Car Dealers
