## Explanation Is Given By Scientist

### Biology Does Not Contend Man Descended From Ape, Is Declaration

SAN FRANCISCO, May 29.—It is imperative that we fully realize that a fight to the finish between science and dogma is now in progress throughout the United States, with science the under dog.

The fundamentalists are firmly entrenched, so firmly, in fact, that if an election on the point could be held tomorrow in such broad minded states as California, for instance, they would be able to pass an initiative measure forbidding teaching evolutionary biology in educational institutions.

The battle now being fought in Tennessee is a vital one. If the fundamentalists succeed, it means they will redouble their efforts in other states, with increased chances for victory. They are now preparing an initiative measure on the subject to be voted on in this state.

The Science League of America will combat this. I am to debate Dr. William Bell Riley of Minneapolis, one of the fundamentalist leaders, on the subject in Los Angeles, Fresno

and Oakland. Other debates are being arranged.

**Handicap Faced**  
We realize the fundamentalists have their greatest strength in the centers, where persons have not been rural sections and smaller urban informed of the scientific point of view, the aims and methods of science.

We know that in a contest with fundamentalists who wave a Bible aloft and invite the uninformed to choose between "the word of God" and a doctrine "which says your grandmother was a monkey," the victory must go to the Bible waver.

But we are going to fight the fundamentalists in their own stronghold. People who understand evolution, who know that it does not teach that man descended from a monkey, do not oppose evolutionary biology.

The fundamentalists' fight is just one development in this of intolerance. Given victory in the reforms, they will go back to old New England witchcraft days for "blue laws" to inflict upon us and life will be as intolerable as in the dark ages and days of the inquisitions.

### Would Not Accept Pay Says Former Governor

OLYMPIA, Wash., May 29.—Governor Louis F. Hart, in a public statement today, denied charges made against him in affidavits of Guy E. Kelly, attorney, and Forbes P. Haskell, Jr., liquidator in charge of affairs of the defunct Scandinavian-American Bank of Tacoma. He made counter charges against them to the effect that they asked him two or three times about dividing the fees, to which he replied, "you can't pay me a cent." He alleges that Kelly wanted to be allowed 5 per cent of all the money handled in the liquidation, which would amount to about \$210,000, to which he (Hart) immediately protested, saying: "My God, Kelly, with that a man could live for years and would not have to hunt a job."

### Doctor Is Sentenced On White Slave Charge

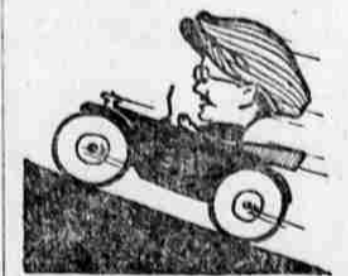

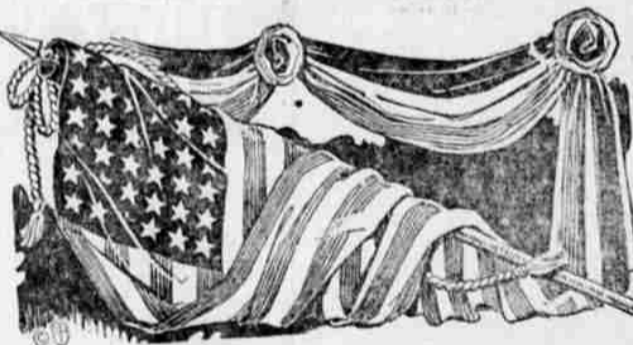
