

THIS MAY WETTEST MONTH IN HISTORY

Rain Falls on Each of 14 Days, Records Show

With 2.77 inches of rain falling in the 31 day period, the past month was the wettest May ever recorded in Bend since the cooperative weather station was established here. It is shown by the weather data compiled today by the cooperative government observer. Fourteen days of the month had a precipitation of more than .01 of an inch.

Indicative of the stormy character of the month is the fact that on only eight days of the 31 did the skies of Central Oregon remain unclouded. On 14 days the skies were entirely overcast by rain clouds. The prevailing direction of the wind was from the west, veering frequently to the south.

Although stormy, May was on the whole warm. The mean minimum temperature being 39.9 degrees. On only three nights during the entire month did the mercury dip below the freezing point. The coldest night of the month was on May 8, when a minimum temperature of 27 degrees was recorded. The maximum temperature was 81 degrees, on May 5. Daily temperatures follow:

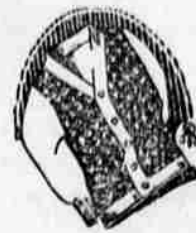
