

CHINESE FAVOR AMERICAN CLAIM

Break In General Strike Comes At Shanghai

Machine Gun Fighting Continues At Canton—Russian Agitators Hunted

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) PEKING, June 8.—Secretaries of the American, British, Italian, Japanese, Belgian and French legations have departed for Shanghai to investigate the recent rioting and to report thereon to the diplomatic corps.

SHANGHAI, June 8.—The first break in the general strike came tonight when strike leaders ordered employes of American firms to return to work.

However, it was determined to maintain the strike against British and Japanese houses. The seamen's union ordered Chinese to quit the British lines, thus tying the Yangtze river and coastal lines, but not affecting Americans.

HONGKONG, June 8.—Machine gun fighting between Yunese troops, holding the city of Canton, and the Canton government forces stationed at Honan island nearby, continues, according to word from Canton today.

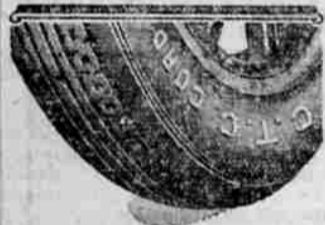
The Yunese were still undefeated, according to the message.

The authorities have been busy hunting Russian agitators, a number of whom took refuge under the German flag in the Sung Shan district. Four arriving at the international settlement in an automobile flying the German emblem were refused admission.

Civil War Brewing

Civil war at Canton has been brewing for some days and some foreigners, including Americans, were reported to be quitting the city in anticipation of an outbreak.

This break came over the week end when the Yunese general, Yang Hsi Min, after ordering the Canton authorities to quit mobilizing, started his men against Honan.

M'NAUGHTANS HERE TO STAGE ELK SHOW

TWO BALLOONS COME TO GRIEF

British Gas Bag Hits Moving Train

Spanish Entry In Bennett Race Falls Into Sea, Passengers Rescued

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) BRUSSELS, June 8.—Two of the 18 balloons which sailed away yesterday in the Gordon Bennett cup race were reported today to have come to grief.

The first was the British balloon Elsie, involved in an odd accident. She crashed into a moving train near Etaples on the English channel, in the department of Pas de Calais, France. Before the crash came she was in danger of being swept out to sea. The occupants of the balloon are safe.

The second bag to meet with a mishap was the Spanish Hesperia, reported to have fallen into the sea with her passengers rescued by a steamer.

The American air service bag S-14 landed early today, apparently without incident, while two Spanish, one French and one Italian balloons had been reported landed upon this evening. Reports on the others are still awaited.

Platting Agents Meet In Roseburg District

Conducted by W. B. Osborne, Jr., assistant district forester in charge of fire control work, a meeting of central platting agents was held in Glendale, in the Roseburg country, last week, reports W. O. Harriman, assistant supervisor of the Deschutes national forest, who returned to Bend Sunday.

The central dispatching system of handling and reporting forest fires is gradually being extended to the various forests of the north Pacific district. The Deschutes national forest has one of the best equipped central platting stations in the district. The Deschutes station is located in Bend, and is in direct touch with all parts of the forest.

CHICAGO, June 8.—Coach A. A. Stagg of the University of Chicago today pronounced the 21st national interscholastic track and field meet run last week the most successful in the history of the games. Five records were broken and 800 athletes competed.

LOS ANGELES, June 8.—Harry Williams, president of the Pacific Coast league, has announced the indefinite suspension of Wade "Red" Killifer, manager of the Seattle club, William McCabe, left fielder, and George Cutshaw, Seattle coach. The suspensions were the result of an disagreement with the umpire in Saturday's game with Los Angeles.

Huge Toll of Life Is Taken By Floods Through Mexico

LONDON, June 8.—Four hundred and fifty persons, suspected of communist activities, were arrested by the Sofia police Sunday, according to an Exchange Telegraph message from Sofia today.
