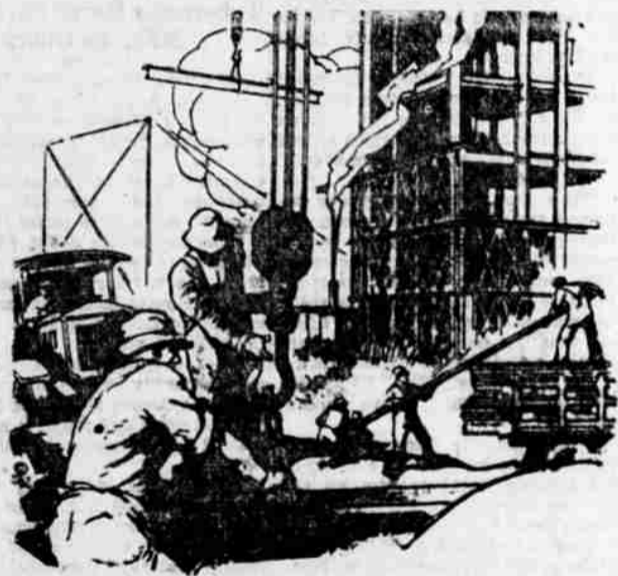
**CHICAGO, June 10.**—Sixty-two colleges and universities have entered athletes in the National A. A. track

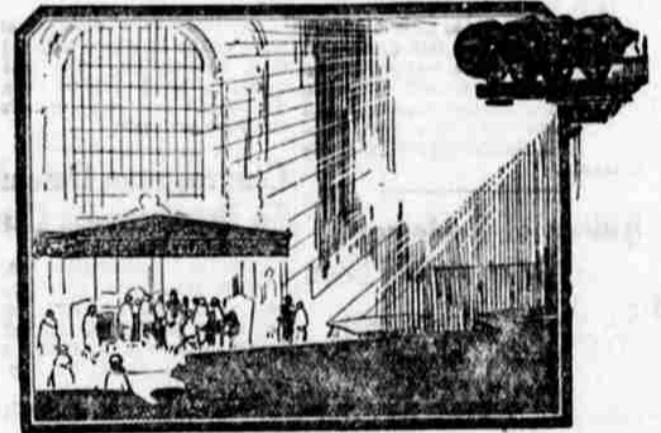
