Oldest Pioneer Dies At The Dalles, Aged 92

THE DALLES, June 11.—Joshua E. Hardy—"Uncle Josh"—oldest citizen pioneer of The Dalles, died here today at the age of 92. Hardy crossed the plains from Hannibal, Mo., his birthplace, in a wagon train in 1851, coming to The Dalles

in 1852. He was a painter and an artist, and besides painting most of the early buildings of this section and the steamboats that patronized the upper Columbia river, produced many good canvases.

Hardy went to school at Hannibal with Mark Twain (Samuel Clemens) and, as he expressed it some time ago, "never thought Sam would amount to much."

He painted a large picture of the

Clemens farm when he was 16 years of age.
