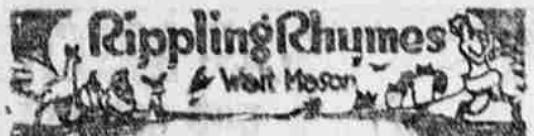

The grand jury returned a not true bill in the case of the congressman after hearing testimony of Earl C. Pound, president, and three other officials of the district.

The officials told the grand jury that they paid Swing's expenses on a trip to Washington during a recess of congress to attend a hearing on the Colorado river development project. They denied they paid him a retainer's fee and said the expense money was later returned.
