Wheat Governs Prices, New High Mark Gained

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) CHICAGO, June 19.—Action of wheat governed trading in grain futures on the Chicago board of trade today. The bread grain went into new high ground on the higher movement and its strong undertone checked an inevitable break in coarse grains.

General crop advice showed favorable condition in the corn belt. This with a weakened spot market capped recessions from an early bulge. Strength in wheat, however, checked the downturn fraction above the opening. Buying in oats was based on the market's firm undertone. Weather and crop news was most favorable.

Hill Road Extension Sure, Says Campbell

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) KLAMATH FALLS, June 19.—"The Hill roads are coming to Klamath. You can depend upon that. Whether they get common user on the Southern Pacific or not, they are coming."

This was the statement of Thomas K. Campbell, public service commissioner of Oregon, who arrived in Klamath Falls with Commissioner E. W. Ostrander.

"The plan of the Oregon public service commission in initiating the action before the interstate commerce commission to force common user by the Hill lines of the Southern Pacific tracks from Odell Junction to Klamath Falls, was taken up because we want to get away from any useless duplication in railroad building in Oregon, since there are 20,000 miles that should be built in the state and we should make the railroad building money go as far as it possibly can."
