

# Summer Swimming Schedule Goes In Effect On Monday

## MAXIMUM USE OF TANK AIM

### Instruction to be Given Bend Children

The new summer swimming schedule, designed to give the public greater use of the gymnasium swimming tank than ever before, goes into effect Monday evening. It was announced today by Paul Arer, who is in charge. The tank will be open to the general public every evening except Thursday evenings, when it is reserved for men only, and on Sundays, when there will be no swimming, the water being changed on that day.

In planning the new schedule the people in charge have tried to provide a time that will be convenient for everyone who desires to swim. From 2 o'clock to 4:30 every afternoon during the week the children will be given free swimming instruction, and the saving work will be offered to the more advanced swimmers.

On Wednesdays from 4:30 to 8 o'clock p. m., the tank will be open for women only, at which time free instruction will be given to those who desire it.

On all the other days of the week except Sunday, the tank will be open to the general public from 4:30 to 6 p. m.

During the evening hours, 7 to 10 o'clock, the tank will be open to the general public except, as already stated, on Thursday evening when the tank is reserved for men only.

On Tuesday and Friday evenings some entertainment will be provided, making this more of a social swim than the other days.

The pool is to be cleaned on Sundays. The water is being kept pure at all times by the filter plant, which has recently been overhauled. Frequent tests will be made of the water to insure an accurate knowledge of its condition.

The admission charge will be 25 cents, which will include a towel. A 10-cent ticket can be purchased for \$1.50. Suits will be furnished with an additional 10-cent fee. A new stock of suits has been ordered, insuring an adequate supply. Swimmers are urged to check their valuables at the window.

An instructor will be in charge at all times that the tank is open, whether to school children or to the general public.

Students of grade or high school age will not be charged fees except for suits, provided they apply for admission at the time scheduled for them on the program, but they will be charged the regular fee if they swim during the hours that the tank is open to the general public.

No one with a severe cold or other contagious disease may enter the tank at any time. A doctor's certificate of good health may be required of any person by the manager.

No one will be permitted to enter the tank without first taking a shower bath.

The instructor reserves the right to determine the time the students may remain in the tank. Proper conduct will be required of all who visit the tank.

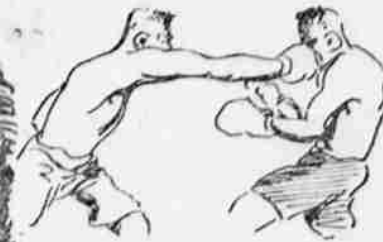
