

AUTO CARAVAN IS ANNOUNCED

Red, White and Blue Cars to Visit

An added attraction in Bend and Prineville during the state convention of the American Legion next week will be the three colored caravan of Hudson and Essex coaches, brought here through the efforts of Lewis E. Seelye, Hudson-Essex dealer in Central Oregon. Of this caravan, the Sunday Oregonian says:

"The Hudson and Essex, red, white and blue caravan, carrying the message of the Hudson-Essex coaches and their prices, has left for its trip around the state. For a week the red, white and blue cars have attracted an unusual amount of attention on the streets of this city, with their striking coats of Opel lacquer. Special attention was paid to the finish of the cars that they might present as attractive appearance as possible and 12 coats was used in the finish, explained Manager S. V. W. Peters of the Portland Motor Car Company, which is sponsoring the caravan and its message to all of the state.

"Charles M. Lempert, executive of the Sherwin-Williams Company, which furnished the materials for the finish, was in this city last week and as a result of his visit and his inspection of the cars, Portland will receive much favorable publicity at the hands of the concern, which will broadcast the idea in other cities throughout the country.

"The General Petroleum Corporation is cooperating in the caravan and the cars will be powered with General gas on the trip over the state.

"Oscar M. Lefferts, wholesale representative of the Portland Motor Car Company, is the "missionary" in charge of the caravan and the cars are manned by three careful and experienced drivers and courtesy will be the slogan on the trip.

"Peters, in discussing the idea of the caravan, said: "While we had the idea in mind and the cars ready to go just before we heard of the good news of a further drop in prices of Hudson and Essex closed cars, the caravan idea is now of greater importance than ever, carrying as it does a message of economy and extra value. It is our purpose to let everyone in the state know, as far as possible, just what we have to offer as Hudson and Essex distributors.

"Judging from the inquiries and orders we have hooked since the announcement of the reduction, we are going to be greatly embarrassed in filling the orders. We have in anticipation of this condition, a large amount of extra orders in at the Hudson factory, which we have every reason to believe the factory will fill owing to its increased production. We will do our best at any rate to see that no one who wants a Hudson or Essex closed car is disappointed."

New Production Record Made By Ford Company

The Ford Motor company set a new record for production Tuesday, May 19, when its assembly plants turned out 7,558 Ford cars and trucks in the eight hour working day. This record is for the United States plants alone and does not include foreign plants and associated companies of the Ford Motor Company of Canada, Ltd.

An interesting thing in connection with this remarkable production is that the company is exceeding its most careful estimates for May. Current Ford billboards, which were prepared sixty days ago, carry the message, "7,000 More Since Yesterday." But in actual output the company exceeded this by 558.

Production of the company has been steadily increased during the last few weeks due to the growing spring business and new output records have been frequent, but none approaching within 100 of the remarkable figure of Tuesday.

On April 28 the domestic plants beat a record of 7,482 established a year ago by assembling 7,594 cars and trucks. This record stood until May 12 when production went to 7,732.

Service Men Victims Of Loan Shark Group

WASHINGTON, June 20.—A nation wide drive to stamp out activities of money lenders, who are offering loans to ex-service men who put up adjusted compensation certificates as security, was started today by the United States secret service. Chief Moran announced that operations in San Antonio had seized 235 certificates said to be held by a money lender who was making approximately 100 per cent on advances to ex-service men. Evidence uncovered by agents has been turned over to the United States district attorney at San Antonio "for determination," Moran said.

Sales of Oldsmobiles Show Large Increases

Continued increase in retail sales of Oldsmobiles and a general feeling that business conditions are good throughout the greater portion of the country is reported by D. S. Edlins, general sales manager of Oldsmobile Motor Works. The Oldsmobile factory entered June with advance orders that will assure it full production throughout the month, and indications are that July production will be satisfactory.

Sales of Oldsmobiles during May were more than 26 per cent greater than during the same month last year. This is the third consecutive month that Oldsmobile sales have shown a substantial increase over those for the same periods in 1924.

"The northwestern section of the country is showing remarkable prosperity, according to both the reports and orders received by our distributors and dealers in that section," said Edlins. "This excellent showing is extending practically without a break from the western shore of Lake Michigan to the Pacific coast.

"Other sections of the country which have not shown such remarkable gains as has the northwest are reporting improved conditions, and every indication points to steady, continued prosperity for Oldsmobile.

"Our export business is steadily gaining. During May we shipped nearly 600 Oldsmobiles abroad, and so far this year our exports are larger than they have been at any time in our 28 years of manufacture."

Deputies Are Accused Of Dealing With Rifles

PARIS, June 20.—The procureur general is preparing a complaint in which Communist deputies Doriot and Marty will be accused of having "intelligence with the enemy"—the Rifians.

The government is aroused at the situation created by the communists' position toward the Moroccan campaign and it is claimed that important military documents have been diverted and transmitted to Abd El Krim, Rifian chieftain.

Premier Painleve has decided to lay all the facts of the communists' alleged role before the chamber of deputies on Tuesday and to demand that the chamber remove the parliamentary immunity of the two members and authorize that proceedings be instituted against them, based on the procureur general's charges.

Announce Cut In Price In Overland Six Sedan

The price of the model 93 standard Overland six cylinder sedan has been reduced to \$1,936 at Bend, it was announced today by R. S. McClure, dealer, following receipt of telegraphed information from the Willys-Overland Pacific Co., Oregon distributors, at Portland.

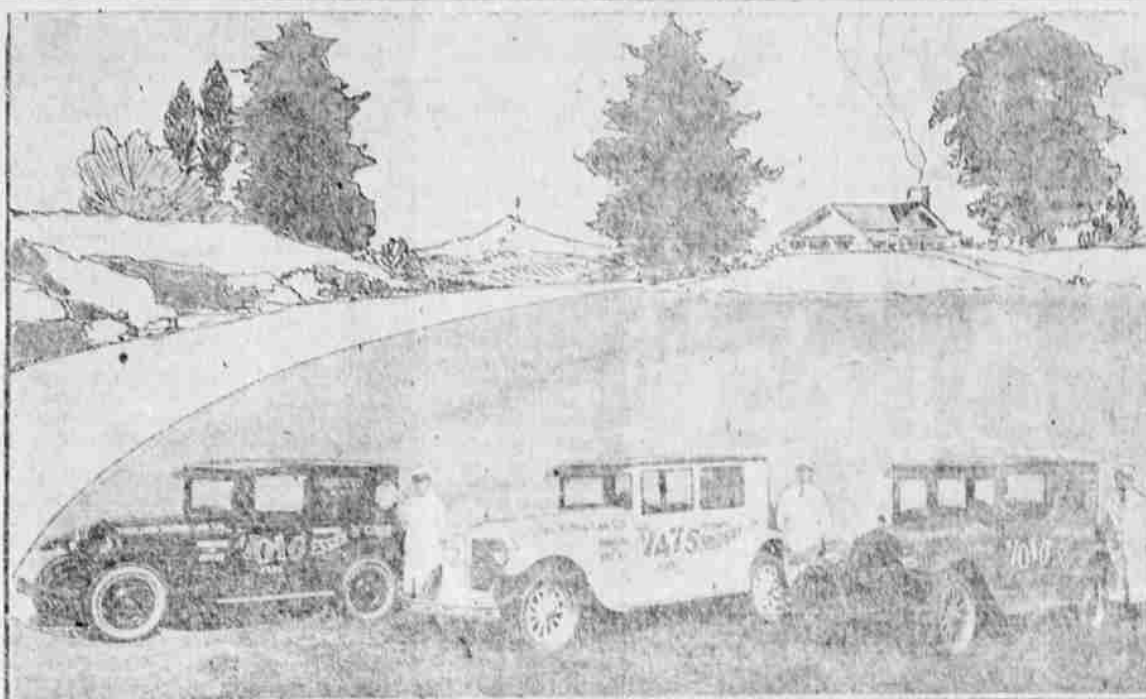
"This reduction made possible by tremendous production on this model," the wire states.

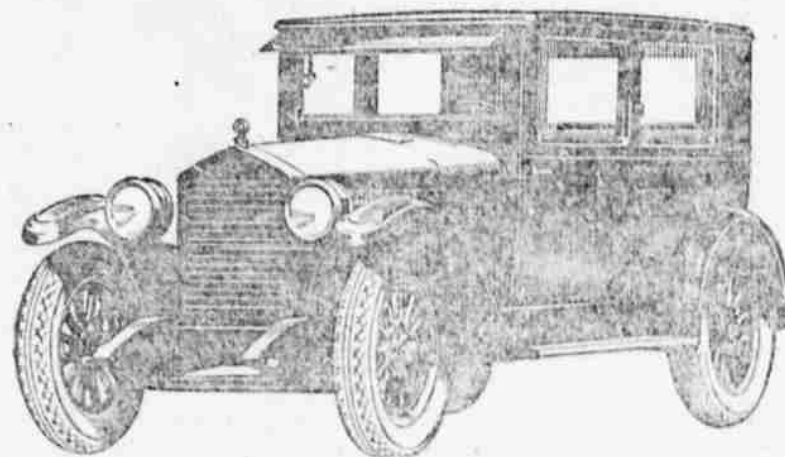
National Guardsman Is Suicidal at Camp

TACOMA, Wash., June 20.—Richard Chaloner, 19, son of M. Ch. Chaloner, Tacoma, was killed Sunday in his first day at Camp Murray, south of here, at 5:25 a. Saturday. Chaloner, private in Company H, 161st Infantry, held the muzzle of an army service rifle against his head with his left hand pulled the trigger with his right. The shot availed five other men in the tent. Death was instantaneous.

No motive for the suicide was apparent. An investigation board was ordered by Brigadier General C. H. Rothen, commanding the camp.
