LITTLE TREND

Dupont and General Motors Feature

(Wall Street Journal Financial Review)
NEW YORK, June 22.—Price movements in today's markets were without definite trend. Fluctuations in the main body of stocks were narrow and meaningless. In issues in which special movements took place the variations were about equally divided between advances and recessions that the day's transactions supplied no clue regarding the immediate sales.

Oils were subject to considerable pressure but this appeared largely in the nature of speculative profit taking. On the constructive side, Dupont and General Motors were the principal features. After the announcement of a 50 per cent stock dividend Dupont dropped four points on heavy realizing sales. The market closed lower.

Grain Futures Slump
After Crops Reports

CHICAGO, June 22.—Grain futures slumped sharply in today's trading on the board of trade. Corn led in the down turn.

Movement of new wheat in good volume from southwest states was the dominant factor in lowering wheat prices. Sellers fought to unload at prevailing prices when interior markets reported liberal receipts of new wheat raising high in protein and a fair range of quality. Corn weakened and also was a factor in wheat's slump. This grain slumped principally because weather favored the crop.

Heavy selling by the leading bull interests weakened provisions despite higher hog and better cables.

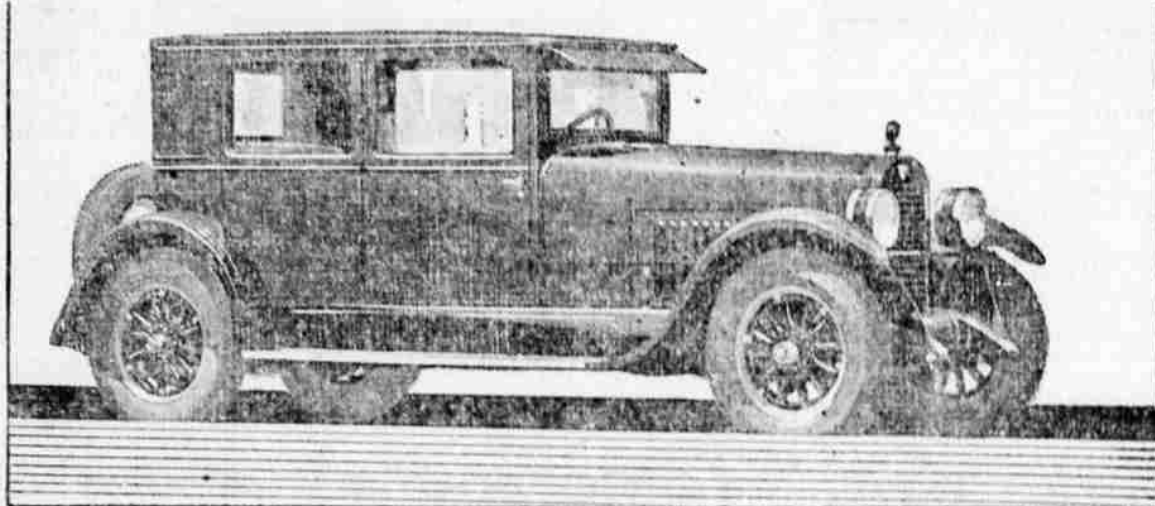
