Judge Lynch further instructed the jury that under the law a defendant's testimony must be considered the same as that of any other witness. Shepherd testified in his own behalf.

**NEW BOOKS ADDED AT LOCAL LIBRARY**

Architectural Wonders of Europe Preserved

Eighteen new volumes of travel in Europe, Africa, South and Central America, and dealing with real estate, newspaper manufacture and miscellaneous subjects of practical nature, have just been catalogued at the Deschutes county public library. And are now ready for distribution, says Miss Helen Johns, librarian. The new books are as follows:

**Travel in Europe**  
 Edwards—Vanished Halls and Cathedrals of France.  
 Edwards—Vanished Towers and Churches of Flanders. Beautiful volumes preserving in picture and text cathedrals and other famous buildings, most of them destroyed in the war. Companion volumes to the author's "Holland of Today" and "Alsace-Lorraine."  
 Hallays—The Spell of Alsace.  
 Vase—The Spell of Flanders. Synthetic impressions of the people and scenery of Alsace and Flanders. The author interestingly combines history with discussions of art and literature. Illustrations are in color and in black and white.

**Africa and South Central America**  
 Marcossou—An African Adventure. Romantic adventures in South and Central Africa. Much information about commercial development including American enterprise in the Belgian Congo.  
 May—2,000 Miles Through Chile. Describes characteristics of the Chileans, their social customs and industries. Author says that Chile has been much influenced by the United States and is more like this country than any other South American country.  
 Gulse—Six Years in Bolivia. An engineer's impressions of the country.  
 Cunningham—Gypsying Through Central America. Tramping through the Central American countries.  
 Kipling—Letters of Travel, 1892-1912. In these letters Kipling gives his impressions of the United States as well as of European countries.

**Real Estate, Law, Newspapers**  
 Babcock—The Appraisal of Real Estate. Deals separately with the various types of property: income, residential, farm and lease equities, setting forth the principles underlying scientific real estate appraising. Gives actual processes of computing net income, depreciation. Working tables and formulas appended.  
 Wellman—The Art of Cross Examination. A new edition of this sound discussion of cross examination with numerous excellent examples.  
 Hyde—Handbook for Newspaper Workers. A satisfactory mechanical handbook, presenting with directness every phase of copy preparation, from punctuation to proof reading, and including as well chapters on the writing of news, accuracy in writing, the building of headlines and the law of libel considered chiefly in its relation to journalism.

**Useful Knowledge Books**  
 Kellogg—Lumber and Its Uses. Tells in simple, non technical fashion about the properties and uses of the principal American species which are manufactured into lumber. New edition.  
 Saylor—Tinkering With Tools. A manual for the "handy man" who likes tools, with practical information on their selection and care, and illustrating their use.  
 Schwarzkopf—Plain and Ornamental Forging. Textbook for self instruction end for technical schools. A section is devoted to art forging and ornamental iron work.
