Rides Despite Injury

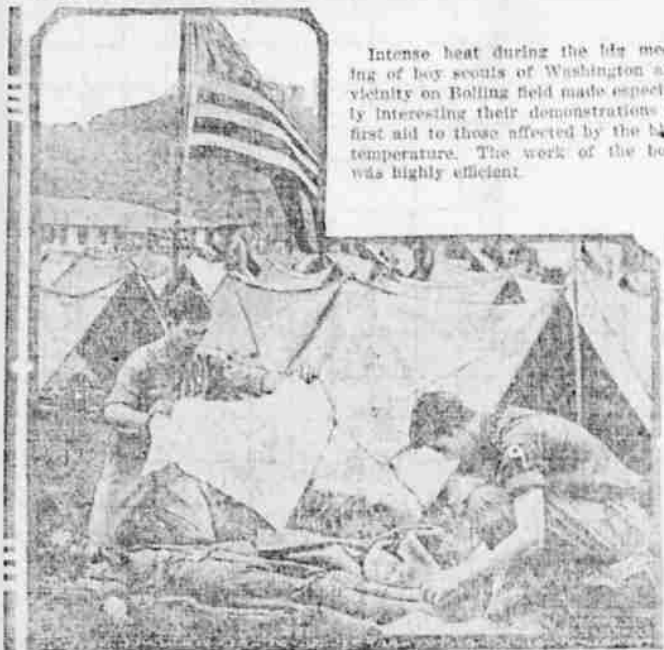
