STOCKS STRONG, TRADERS WAIT

Call Money Rates Continue High

(Wall Street Journal Financial Review)
NEW YORK, June 30.—Stocks developed considerable strength today despite a disposition shown by traders to await easier call money before making extensive buying commitments. Although Monday's six per cent figure was not duplicated, the ruling rate was 5 1/2 per cent, a factor which exercised important influence in reducing the volume of dealings.
Despite the leisurely pace which characterized the trading, the general list registered complete reassurance regarding the immediate outlook. Heavy short selling precipitated by the earthquake in the previous session had imparted additional strength to the market's unrelenting and fairly brisk operations for the rise went ahead all day in special stocks.
Among the issues in which the bullish demonstrations were vigorous were American Can, Baldwin, Woolworth, United Clear Stores, Ward Baking "B," Wright Aero and Independent Oil & Gas.
