## Bar Rockefeller Pastor As Delegate

### Oregon Minister, At Seattle Convention, Adds to Heat of Morning Session

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) SEATTLE, July 1.—Rev. Cornelius Woolfkin, pastor of the Park Avenue Baptist church of New York, which is the church of John D. Rockefeller, Jr., was temporarily barred as a delegate to the northern Baptist convention meeting here today by the credentials committee. His fight for the floor will come up as a special order of business this afternoon.

The rockbound fundamental, evangelical doctrines of the church were endorsed with resounding and prolonged cheers during the morning session. Millionaires who give large sums for religious purposes were relegated to a place of little importance.

The fundamentalists were in the ascendancy during the morning session, which was marked by a mounting wave of excitement over the nation wide disputes between modernists and fundamentalists. The modernists are yet to be heard on the topics of the morning.

## POSTOFFICE TO BE FIRST CLASS SOON

### Increase In Fiscal Year Is \$3,636.15, Reported

Increase of postal receipts in the Bend postoffice for the fiscal year which ended at midnight last night over the previous fiscal year totals \$3,636.15, virtually assuring an advance of the local postoffice from second class to first class by the end of the calendar year. Postal receipts are based on the calendar year.

For the calendar year, the postal receipts of the Bend postoffice jumped from \$17,487.82 cents in the first six months of 1924 to \$19,287.91 for the same period this year, according to figures compiled this afternoon in the local postoffice. In order to be advanced to the first class, the goal which must be attained is a gain of \$700 before the end of the present calendar year.

The most notable accomplishments of the Bend postoffice in the past fiscal year were the additions of a new carrier route, serving all of West 12th street and a considerable part of the southwest part of the city, and the inauguration of a continuous carrier service to the business section of the city. All first class mail is delivered to the business houses regardless of the time it is received in Bend.

In reviewing the work of the past year, Postmaster J. J. Hogan this afternoon made known that a new motor route, serving some 92 families southeast of Bend, in the Arnold district, would probably be approved by the postal authorities in the near future. A petition for the start of such a route is now being circulated, and will be submitted to the postal authorities in the next few days. The proposed route will be 27 miles long.

Indicative of the magnitude of the work carried on by the Bend postoffice in the 1924-25 fiscal year is the fact that more than 9,000 C. O.

## RANGE OF WEATHER IS WIDE IN MONTH

### Seventy Degrees Variance In Temperature in June

June was characterized by a wide range of temperature. It is shown by records of the cooperative weather observer in Bend. The maximum temperature was 99 degrees, on June 26, and the minimum 29 degrees, on June 3. The mean maximum temperature for the month was 76.2 degrees. The mean maximum temperature for June, 1924, was 78 degrees.

Although 12 days of the month were cloudy or partly cloudy, the precipitation for June amounted to only .29 of an inch. The heaviest daily precipitation for the month was .12 of an inch, on the fifth. The prevailing direction of the wind was from the west.

## PICNICS FEATURE OF INDEPENDENCE DAY

### Grange, Brooks-Scanlon and La Pine Make Plans

Celebrations at Tumalo Island, McKenzie Bridge, La Pine and other places, and a double holiday with innumerable enticing spots in the wooded hills of the Deschutes country will, in all probability, draw heavily on the population of Bend this coming week end—July 4 and Sunday.

With virtually all places of business closing and the mills shutting down in observance of Independence day, Bend next Saturday will very likely be a deserted city. The caravans of Brooks-Scanlon employees will leave for their outing grounds on the Willamette slope on the morning of July 4, and will not return until Sunday afternoon.

One of the big attractions of the mid state country for July 4 will be the picnic at Tomalo Island. This picnic, being held under the auspices of the county grange, will be featured by a program of sports, addresses by speakers noted in the state, a baseball game, and an impressive musical program. A dance will be held at Tumalo hall Saturday evening. This picnic is not exclusively for grange members—it is open to the general public.

La Pine will be one of the few towns in Central Oregon to observe July 4. La Pine's big attraction will be a rodeo. The Houston Brothers of Prineville will have a string of 25 mean broncs at the La Pine rodeo to furnish entertainment. According to information reaching Bend from La Pine, an excellent frontier program has been prepared.

No celebration will be held in Bend on July 4. Plans for the observance of the day were considered by the Bend Merchants' association and the American legion, but it was decided that such a celebration would follow too closely the convention celebration in Prineville. It was for this same reason that other towns in the mid state country decided not to prepare an elaborate program for Independence day.

The Brooks-Scanlon employees' outing will probably be attended by 400 or 500 people. The trip to the picnic grounds below McKenzie Bridge will be made over the scenic McKenzie pass road, said to be in excellent condition this week.

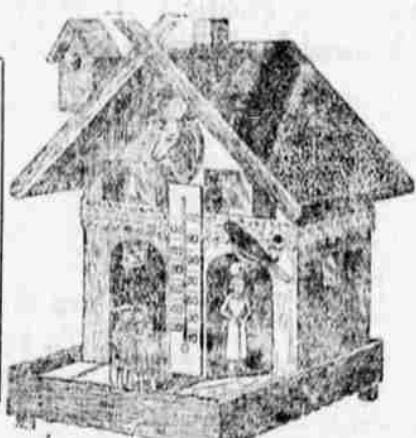
