CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas, July 6.—Three men are dead and two others are in a serious condition today as the result of a gun battle in a road house here Sunday night.

The dead are Paul McAllister, deputy game warden; R. R. Bledsoe, deputy constable of Nueces county, and C. M. Bisbee, constable of Nueces county. Rufus McMurray of Three Rivers, who was shot several times, may die, and George Ryder of San Diego, shot below the heart, is expected to recover.

"SALVATION HUNTERS" OPENS AT THE CAPITOL THEATER
"Salvation Hunters," the new motion picture that has aroused almost unprecedented enthusiasm, makes its debut before local audiences this week, commencing today at the Capitol theater. "Salvation Hunters" is a film that came to the screen under circumstances almost as dramatic as the salvation hunt in the story itself. Produced by a practically unknown director and a cast of volunteer professionals in Hollywood, "Salvation Hunters" proved to be a winning number against the thousand chances that a film made in this precarious way would fail. Hard boiled motion picture experts were astonished and even humbled at seeing the quality of production made on back lots and in city back alleys under all the handicaps of a scanty bank roll and resources. The picture was at once acclaimed by film celebrities who were so big that they could afford to recognize frankly a work of genius from obscure sources. Von Sternberg, in a fashion new to the screen, tells a story that is new, and with a symbolism that is new. Full of dramatic suspense, touched with ironic humor, "Salvation Hunters" presents also a subtle mysticism that intrigues the theater goers with a sense of life's under current flowing beneath the celluloid scenes. Since its introduction to the most critical of New York's public, "Salvation Hunters" has been on the high tide of popular admiration and its principal players—George K. Arthur, Georgia Hale, Otto Matthesen, Little Bruce Guerin, Olaf Hyattson and Nellie Hyl Baker—are dividing attention with older motion picture stars.
