

Pittsburgh Club Retains Hold On National League Lead

TEAMS DIVIDE DOUBLE HEADER

Pirates Take First and Giants Second

POLO GROUNDS, New York, July 8.—Pittsburgh retained the lead in the National league pennant race after splitting even in a double header with the New York Giants today.

Pittsburgh blasted Scott and McQuillan out of the box and by hard hitting won the first game, 12 to 3. The Giants won the second game, 5 to 3 with a four run rally in the seventh inning. Kelly supplied three of the runs with a homer with Frisch and Menzel on base.

Moore hit a homer for Pittsburgh in the ninth.

POLO GROUNDS, New York, July 9.—Pittsburgh clinched a hold of first place in the National league pennant race by slaughtering the New York Giants, 12 to 3 in the first game of a double header today.

Bunching hits in two big innings, the Pirates blasted Scott and McQuillan out of the box and scored more than enough runs to win.

Irish Menard's home run in the fourth inning with Young and Frisch on the bases was the only effective hit the Giants scored off Emil Yde, the Pittsburgh southpaw.

The crowd had swollen to 50,000 before the second game started with Warfield Dean and Johnny Morrison as opposing hurlers.

The Pirates scored in the first inning on singles by Carey, Cuyler and Barnhardt. In the Giants' half Young was on third with none out, but his mates could not bring him in.

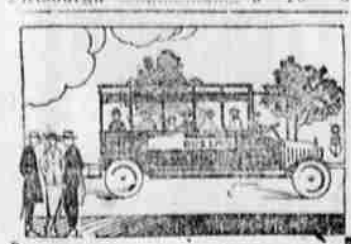

KEARNS IS GIVEN A FRESH OPENING

Boxing Commission Shifts Attack to Walker

NEW YORK, July 9.—With Harry Wills on his way to Europe complaining about a bad hand, and Jack Dempsey on the high seas coming this way, Jack Kearns, who is null and void with the New York boxing commission, may get a chance to slip back at the solons.

Kearns, it was learned today, is planning to go before the commission as soon as he talks to Dempsey, slap the signature of the champion on the agreement to accept the Wills challenge and then inquire "Where's this Wills? My fellow is here!"

The commission can't make any nasty cracks about Dempsey returning on the same date that the negro challenger called, because Kearns told the members of the board two weeks ago that Dempsey would be back early in July.

Kearns is also in a good position to inquire why he is being pushed around so about a Dempsey-Wills fight when one of the members of the commission has said that he was of the opinion that a Dempsey-Wills fight never could be held.

Mickey Walker, the welterweight champion and a stable mate of Dempsey under the management of Kearns, will be back on the pan today. The commission ordered him to appear today and say when and where he was going to live up to his signed agreement to fight Dave Shadle for the welterweight championship.

Kearns will not be allowed to appear and press his wishes for a fight in California, and Walker, although he is no dummy, will be in a tough spot to talk against Leo Flynn, who says his Dave Shadle will fight in New York or nowhere. Walker has one offer from Jack Doyle for Vernon, and Shadle has signed to stage the fight at the polo grounds.

Today he is under arrest in New York, charged with attempting to defraud the government of income taxes totaling nearly \$500,000.

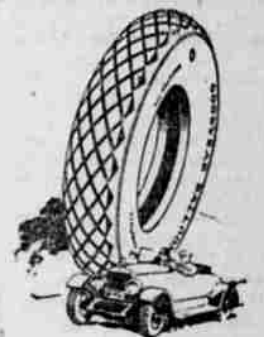
