NOGALES, Ariz., July 9.—The body of George Jarrrel, wealthy Arizona cattleman, who had been mysteriously missing two months, arrived here today from the Mexican side of the border.

The body was found buried under a pile of gravel in a canyon, 30 miles south of the border, by Deputy Sheriff James Hathaway, Nogales, attracted to the scene by buzzards flying overhead.

cab man, that Saye put him in touch with Harry Woods, whom he had not seen before, and that Woods hired the two others who started out with him. These men quit the job and others were hired in Klamath county.

Didn't Tell Anybody
To explain the diversity of brands, Gooderham told Woods that he bought the cattle from several Indians. They were driven down the main road, no attempt being made at concealment.

"I took nobody into my confidence and if I had put the deal across, nobody would have been taken into my confidence," he said.

The government grazing experts were frankly skeptical of Gooderham's story.

"If you drove those cattle out yourself, you are some backdoor, that's all I've got to say," was the remark of one.

"They were the first cows I had ever driven, and I had no more control over them than if I'd been a baby," was the reply. "It took me three days to drive them the first eight miles."

The government men believed that some Indians helped Gooderham drive the cattle from the reservation, if the men who were arrested with the cattle in their possession did not do so.

WILL CERTIFY VALE PROJECT

State Support Insisted
On by Dr. Mead

Tangle In Contract Hlds
Up Baker—Owyhee Must
Organize District

BAKER, Ore., July 9.—Work on the Vale reclamation project in Malheur county will be certified by the interior department as soon as Governor Pierce can assure state support in financing and assisting settlers. Dr. Elwood Mead, commissioner of reclamation, declared here today.

Mead, Secretary of Interior Work, and a party of government officials were here today to inspect the Baker project.

The Baker project need not wait except to adjust a tangle in the contract for the work, Dr. Mead said, while the Owyhee project must form a district to bring government aid.

Oregon is the one state in the union that by voluntary effort is giving the government that cooperation which is desired in colonizing reclamation projects, Dr. Mead declared.

Governor Pierce, Senator Stanford and Congressman Sinnott and Crumpacker are here with the interior department officials.

Reformatory Youths Flee, Death of One Is Reported

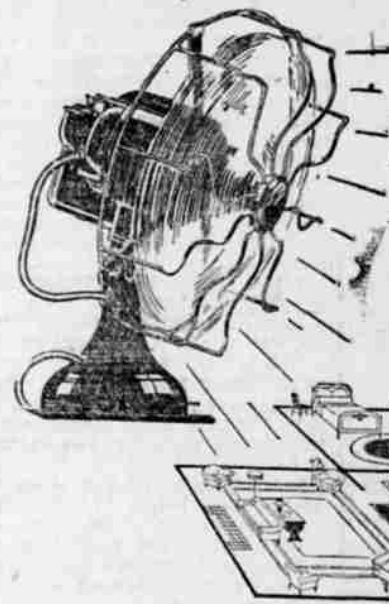
