

WATER SUPPLY HERE PRAISED

Member of State Board
Redmond Speaker

Lessening of Disease Men-
tioned As Result of
Greater Purity

(Special to The Bend Bulletin)
REDMOND, July 10.—Bend and Redmond are the only two towns in Oregon which have weekly tests made of the municipal water supply by the state board of health. This was the statement of Dr. William Levin of the state board before the Homemakers' Institute here yesterday afternoon.

"Bend has pure water, we know that because we test it every week; it has never been impure except the one time over which there was so much ado and which was to the state board of health but one of a number of similar flurries from all over the state. I am taking back to Portland tonight a sample of Redmond's water and will test it and find out whether it is pure or not."

Dr. Levin said later in an interview that Bend's water is as pure as Portland's Bull Run water, and sometimes even better.

"It has been found that where a water supply is purified, intestinal diseases decrease as well as all other diseases. Running water is claimed to purify itself in a certain number of miles, but this depends upon con-

ditions and it may be more or less miles."

Under community health problems the speaker discussed water and food, especially milk, and sewage and garbage disposal. The problems of the country residents as compared and contrasted with those of the small town or city were stressed in the talk.

Proper understanding of prevention and control of communicable diseases has cut them down 50 per cent during the last 20 years, he said. Quarantine, while admitted to be necessary and useful, was given but little credit for control of diseases like scarlet fever, diphtheria and smallpox. Toxins and anti toxins were discussed at length with some of the new discoveries along this line in other diseases.

Health Purchasable
"It costs money to have good health in the community. Good health is purchasable and during the last decade we have raised the average normal span of life from 50 to 55. We hope we can bring it to 75. It is doubtful if it would be well to raise it higher, but we would all like to live to 75 and this can be done if we sow the seeds of good health."

Between 125 and 150 women from 13 communities in Deschutes county and three or four in Crook county are attending the first Homemakers' Institute in Central Oregon which closes here today. Many of the women come from long distances, one having driven nine miles with a horse and buggy to be among those present. Thirteen children, three of them tiny babies, were taken care of yesterday by the Redmond campfire girls in the nursery which they are maintaining in the high school.

The programs have been divided into five parts, clothing, food, health, recreation and inspiration.

"We feel that if we can help the homemakers to save time in their work then we should give them something to enjoy and so have something inspirational on the program each day," said Mrs. Jessie D. McComb, director of the institute. In commenting on the program preparation.

Indian Life Described
"Home Life in India," by Miss Martha Wheelodon of Portland, who is home on furlough from her work with the Y. W. C. A. in Bombay, was the inspirational feature yesterday. "Good roads are common in India because the government knows that only with good communication and good roads can there be protection for the people. They learned their lesson in the Dark Hole of Calcutta, and now cars fly over the roads at a great rate and the missionary counts his car next to his Bible."

"Seventy-six different languages are spoken in India, but you can get all over with just English; they know you are 'foreign' and will hunt up someone who can understand you."

Mrs. R. S. Dart of Bend presided at the session yesterday and in adjourning the meeting expressed her hope that another Homemakers' Institute would be held in Deschutes county and asked that those who joined her in that wish should make known their feelings to Mrs. McComb.

Music was furnished by Bend club women yesterday. Mrs. Florence Silvis sang two solos and Mrs. Marion Coyle played two violin numbers. Miss Marian Coyle sang two vocal solos which were delightfully given and, as the other musical numbers of the afternoon, were much appreciated by the women in attendance.

Dr. Caroline Hedger of the McCormick Memorial Institute in Chicago is giving two talks on health today, and the inspirational talk is by Professor Leo Fairbanks, who will talk on "Art in the Home." The music today is provided by Redmond women, with Mrs. N. A. Burdick in charge. Mrs. Meredith Bailey, Jr., of Sisters, is presiding.
