

COOPERATION CLUB KEYNOTE

Industrial Building Emphasized

Speaker Tells Secretaries City Auto Parks Becoming Thing of Past

Cooperation between commercial clubs of Oregon was the keynote of the fifth annual short course for commercial secretaries which closed yesterday at Eugene, L. K. Cramb, Bend Commercial club secretary, said today.

"Two of the most important speeches made at the short course all commercial clubs of the state for a greater Oregon, rather than promote the interests of the individual community. The two speeches were 'How Can a Community Build Industrially?' by W. B. D. Dodson of Portland and 'State Development and the State Chamber,' by W. G. Ide of the Oregon State Chamber of Commerce. Another outstanding talk was 'The Tourist' by W. A. Reid of Corvallis.

"The secretaries agreed that the interests of each community and of the state as a whole can be better served by a greater cooperation than we have had before in promoting the industrial life of the state as well as the scenic and recreational possibilities.

"The secretaries expressed a need for meeting oftener to discuss their plans and mutual problems, and an effort will be made to hold regular meetings.

"One of the interesting things brought out at one of the short course meetings was that municipal camps are rapidly becoming a thing of the past. Privately owned camps are taking their places in greatly increasing numbers. Many of the privately owned camps furnish cabins and a great many accommodations which most of the municipal camps have not had. The result is a trend toward lighter tourist equipment, so that it is thought that the time is not far distant when no tourist will think of taking a tent with him, and many of them will travel without bedding and other camp equipment.

"Yes, we had a wonderful time at

Eugene, in spite of all the work we did."

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEND, OREGON, that the following proposed amendments to the charter of said city be and the same hereby are submitted to the legal voters at a special city election to be held as in this resolution provided.

CHARTER AMENDMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE CITY COUNCIL

An Act

To amend an act entitled "An Act to amend an act entitled 'A charter for the City of Bend, County of Crook, State of Oregon,'" submitted to and approved by the voters of said city at an election held therein on November 22nd, 1911; and as subsequently amended by certain acts amendatory thereof submitted to and approved by the voters of said city at an election held therein on August 15, 1916; and as subsequently amended by certain acts submitted to and approved by the voters of said city at an election held therein on April 30, 1917; and as subsequently amended by an act submitted to and approved by the voters of said city at an election held therein on September 25, 1918; and as subsequently amended by an act submitted to and approved by the voters of said city at an election held therein on June 28, 1919; and as subsequently amended by the legal voters of said city at the special elections held therein on May 21, 1920, November 27, 1920, December 7, 1921, December 4, 1922, December 18, 1923, and December 8, 1924; and to amend all acts or amendments heretofore enacted amending the charter of said city or by vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF BEND AND THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF BEND do ordain that an act entitled "An Act to amend an act entitled 'A Charter for the City of Bend, County of Crook, State of Oregon,'" submitted to and approved by the voters of said city at an election held therein on November 22, 1911; and as subsequently amended by certain acts amendatory thereof submitted to and approved by the voters of said city at an election held therein on August 15, 1916; and as subsequently amended by certain acts submitted to and approved by the voters of said city at an election held therein on April 30, 1917; and as subsequently amended by an act submitted to and approved by the voters of said city at an election held therein on September 25, 1918; and as subsequently amended by an act submitted to and approved by the voters of said city at an election held on June 28, 1919; and

as subsequently amended by the legal voters of said city at the special elections held therein on May 21, 1920, November 27, 1920, December 7, 1921, December 4, 1922, December 18, 1923, and December 8, 1924; and as amended by all acts or amendments heretofore enacted by the legislative assembly or by vote of the people, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto Chapter XXXIV to read as follows:

CHAPTER XXXIV

Section 1. For the purpose of procuring funds to acquire and improve a municipal water system for the City of Bend, Oregon, the Council of said City is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and sell General Obligation Water Bonds of the City in the sum of six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000), said bonds to be in denominations of \$500 or \$1000 each, to bear date of July 1, 1925, and to mature serially in numerical order at the rate of \$20,000 per annum on the first days of July in each of the years 1925 to 1946 inclusive, and the remaining \$220,000 on the first day of July, 1947; said bonds to bear interest at the rate of five and one-half per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of January and July, said bonds to be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Recorder of said City, whereby the City of Bend shall be held in substance and effect to undertake and promise to pay to the bearer of each of said bonds at maturity thereof the sum therein named in gold coin of the United States of the present standard of value, together with interest thereon in like gold coin as above provided, said interest to be represented by coupons attached to said bonds bearing the facsimile signatures of the Mayor and Recorder, the principal and interest of said bonds to be payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City, which said bonds shall be known as "City of Bend General Obligation Water Bonds."

Section 2. The Council shall each year at the time of making the annual tax levy for city purposes include in such levy a sum sufficient to pay interest due on the outstanding bonds of this issue and to retire the principal thereof as it matures.

Section 3. The debt limitations contained in the city charter shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that this resolution for proposed charter amendments submitted to the voters by the Council be filed with the Recorder upon its approval by the Mayor for submission to the legal voters of said city for their adoption or rejection to be voted upon at a special election to be held therein, and which said special election is hereby called to be held on the 22nd day of July, 1925; and it is

RESOLVED FURTHER, that a copy of this resolution be forthwith upon its approval transmitted to the

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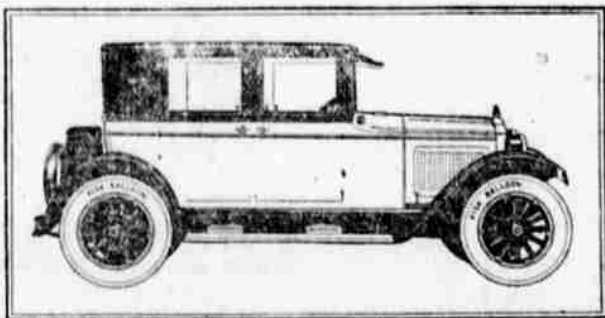
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City Attorney who shall within five (5) days thereafter, provide and return to the Recorder a ballot title for such measure; and it is

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Recorder be and he is hereby instructed to publish this resolution in full, together with the ballot title in The Bend Bulletin, same being a newspaper published in the City of Bend, once not less than ten (10) days before said special election and also by publication thereof once or oftener in said paper within the ten (10) days immediately preceding said special election; and it is

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the 22nd day of July, 1925, between the legal voting hours on said date, that is, from eight o'clock A. M. to eight o'clock P. M., is hereby designated as the time for holding said special election, and the following polling places and the following judges and clerks are hereby designated and ap-

pointed as the places and the officials to conduct said special election, to-wit:

Polling Place, Reid school; Judge, S. R. Hogan, and Clerks, Marie Brosterhous, Mrs. T. W. Carlon, and Neil Markel;

Polling Place, Central School; Judge, Geo. F. Hoover, and Clerks, Mrs. Blaine Garner, Mrs. M. B. O'Brien, and Mrs. H. E. Beach;

Polling Place, Kenwood School; Judge, Blanche Dart, and Clerks, Mrs. E. J. Cathow, Lillian Connarn and Mary R. Bennett.

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the City that the municipal water system for which the aforesaid bonds are to be issued be acquired and improved at as early a date as possible; now, therefore,

AN EMERGENCY is hereby declared to exist and this resolution shall go into force and effect upon

its adoption and approval.
