Friends and relatives of Williams gave him up for lost after several attempts had been made to penetrate the flames in search of him. About two hours later he appeared unhurt.

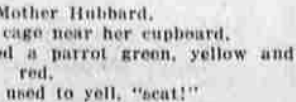

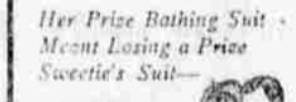

MOUNTAIN LILIES FOUND ARE GIANTS

Single Stem Bears 89 Blossoms and Buds

Mountain lilies which they believe to be the tallest and largest ever found in Central Oregon were found last week by Lois Maker and Hazel Weber of Shevlin-Hixon steel camp. Lois found a single stem with 89 blossoms and buds on it, which she believes to be the largest, and Hazel found one 5 feet 6 inches tall, probably the tallest.

People living near the steel camp believe the mountain lilies grow to greater size near that camp than anywhere else in Central Oregon, but they would like to hear from anyone who can report larger ones, suggesting that they make their finds known through The Bend Bulletin.

The girls who found the unusually large lilies are daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Maker and Mr. and Mrs. H. B. Weber, respectively.

HUGE DAMAGE DONE IN EASTERN STORM

Heaviest Property Loss in Indiana—34 Lose Lives

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) CHICAGO, July 13.—The middle west today counted its dead at 34 and estimated its property damage at more than \$1,000,000 in the wake of wind and electric storms and a severe heat wave.

Heaviest property loss was in Central Indiana, where a terrific wind and rain storm ripped roofs from houses, uprooted trees, levelled telephone and telegraph poles and flooded scores of cellars.

Five persons were drowned in Iowa as thousands sought relief from high temperatures and extreme humidity.

Four persons succumbed to the heat in St. Paul and Minneapolis, where the mercury climbed to 92.

Two were drowned and two died from heat prostration in Chicago. Eight were drowned in Indiana.
