## Washington Federation Urges Amendment

## Pay Increase for Postal Employees Also Favored At Session

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) ABERDEEN, Wash., July 15.—A prolonged fight in the state of Washington for the adoption of the proposed federal child labor amendment loomed today as a result of the action taken by the Washington Federation of Labor in session here.

A resolution was passed yesterday afternoon calling for a conference of all interested organizations to draft plans which will bring about the ratification of the proposal at the legislative session this fall.

It stipulates that each interested organization name two delegates to meet at an early convention to map out a state wide program.

Other resolutions were adopted calling for increased in pay for United States postal employees not affected by the recent advance in scale; for increases in retirement allowances for postal employees; increases in salary for William Short, president of the federation; for adoption of the section of the Clayton act which would prohibit court orders against peaceful picketing during strikes; for the establishment of a United States museum of safety devices at Washington.

A prediction that Governor Roland H. Hartley would be removed from office before his present term expires, because of his hostile attitude towards labor, was made in the annual report of the executive council.

## Washington Industries Manager Leaps to Death

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) SEATTLE, July 15.—John H. McIntosh, 46, manager of the Federated Industries of Washington, jumped to his death from his office

on the ninth floor of the American Bank building, after taking poison. He died instantly. He had been suffering, according to friends, from a nervous breakdown.

## Van Sweringens Fight Petition Sent to I. C. C.

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) WASHINGTON, July 15.—O. P. and M. J. Van Sweringens, in a joint petition filed with the interstate commerce commission, denied that they exercised their interlocking directorates in the Chesapeake and Ohio, Hocking Valley and Nickle Plate railroads to the detriment of the roads or the public.

The two young railroad magnates made a sweeping denial of all charges by counsel representing minority stockholders and requested the commission to dismiss the motion of minority counsel for a reopening of the interlocking directorate proceedings.

## Appeal to Save Lease Put On File by Doheny

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) LOS ANGELES, July 15.—Attorneys for E. L. Doheny, oil magnate, filed an appeal late today from the recent decision of Federal Judge Paul J. McCormick cancelling the Pan-American Petroleum Company's leases to the Elks Hills naval oil reserves.

The government, at the same time, filed a cross appeal.

Arguments on the appeal will be heard in San Francisco on August 15.

A list of 51 alleged errors in Judge McCormick's decision was cited as basis for the appeal.

The Pan-American leases were ordered cancelled on grounds they were obtained through fraud and conspiracy between Doheny and former Secretary of the Interior Albert B. Fall.

## Miss Georgia McKenzie Named as County Nurse

Miss Georgia McKenzie, recently engaged in public health work in South America, was named as Deschutes county nurse at a meeting of the county public health association held Tuesday afternoon. She will be here about August 15 to take over her duties, according to present plans.

Miss McKenzie is to succeed Mrs. T. J. Quigley, nee Miss Grace McDowell, who resigned, after several years' service, when she was married recently.

## Eagles Attack Three Men Invading Mountain Home
