

ARRESTED, TELLS BLACKMAIL PLOT

Is Tricked With Satchel Full of Paper

Demanded \$50,000 from Millionaire as Price of Daughter's Safety

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) NEW YORK, July 18.—Captured in a west side subway station after he had accepted a satchel stuffed with paper from Edward W. Browning, millionaire realtor, Phillip Siegel, a typesetter on the New York Times, is said to have confessed today to a single handed attempt to obtain \$50,000 by blackmail.

Siegel, it is said, threatened to kill Browning and the latter's adopted daughter and walked into a trap after carrying on correspondence through the personal columns of the newspaper and by letter, in which it was arranged that the millionaire should hand over the money this morning.

Browning recently advertised for a child to adopt to be a companion to Dorothy Sunshine Browning, his daughter, who, he said, wasione-some.

Siegel, according to detectives, told them that his attention was attracted by this move of Browning and he decided "that Browning was rich and I wanted money" and thereupon worked out the blackmail plot.

Siegel, according to the purported confession, said he first wrote Browning, threatening to kill both him and his adopted daughter, Dorothy, unless \$50,000 was paid to him immediately. He gave instructions for the payment of the money.

Browning consulted detectives and there followed a long correspondence between Browning and Siegel, by mail and by means of "personal" advertisements in the papers. By reason of his position in the composing room of a paper, Siegel is said to have inserted advertisements without knowledge of the paper's management, making detection more difficult. Finally it was arranged that Siegel and Browning should meet on a street corner, near Central park, at 10 a. m. today and the money was to be paid.

Browning went to the point of rendezvous carrying a satchel full of paper. He waited a few minutes when a nervous looking young man

came up and told him to "hand it over" without further introduction. Browning handed over the bag and Siegel walked away, closely followed by the plain clothes officers who were guarding Browning. As he started into a subway station he was arrested.

Siegel is a member of a respected New York family.

Evolution Obyvious, Says Oxford Man

Fundamentalists Endangering Real Message Contained In Bible

OXFORD, England, July 18.—William Jennings Bryan makes capital out of the disagreement of evolutionists. He seems to forget that there are three branches and scores of sects of Christianity with far more bitter differences.

There is no disagreement whatever among biologists that evolution has occurred and that it applies to man equally with other organisms.

Bryan's own body contains far more circumstantial evidence for evolution than would convict a dozen men of murder.

Human development is even more striking. Do the fundamentalists realize that each of them before birth passed through a phase with a tail and through an earlier phase with gill slits like a fish, and started from one primitive cell?

Evolution is obvious in the development of every human being.

Decries "Worship of Book"

I see that Bryan is threatening to "write the Bible into the United States constitution. (Bryan has denied he meant this literally). Let us hope he remembers that this involves the belief in a flat earth, in demons, witchcraft, condemnation of polygamy and wars of extermination.

Most important, it involves a conception of the deity which is self contradictory since it is impossible to reconcile the warlike and jealous early Jehovah with the just God of the prophets or the loving Father of the new testament.

When will fundamentalists realize that worship of a book is just as stupid and wicked as worship of a graven image and far more dangerous in its consequences?


The amazing thing is that, owing to the pinning their faith to antiquated and unessential ideas in the Bible, they are endangering its real message.

The matter at issue is not in any sense a fight between religion and science but a fight between science and the very primitive obscurantist and socially dangerous religion of the fundamentalists.

Meanwhile the fundamentalists can be happy in the reflection that they are doing their best to de throne America from the position of world leadership she held after the war by making her the laughing stock of civilization.
